Program Highlights

The Asia-Pacific Congress of Clinical Biochemistry, APFCB-2019 will offer you an exciting scientific programme covering varied plenary lectures, workshops, symposia and panel discussions on relevant aspects related to the laboratory medicine. Here is a glimpse of some of the proposed scientific highlights.

The theme for this congress 'Laboratory Medicine - Innovation and Integration' is proposed to have focussed deliberations on how the future of this discipline is influenced by the rapid progress in the technology and to find the ways to cope up with the emerging challenges. The plenary lectures and symposia sessions will be planned to emphasize the theme of the congress and will cover updates on varied aspects of laboratory medicine like cardiac markers, risk factors of cardiovascular diseases, metabolic disorders, biomarkers of renal disorders, endocrinology and metabolism, standardization of thyroid function tests, cancer diagnostics, therapeutic drug monitoring, infectious diseases research, autoimmune diseases, role of molecular biology, proteomics and metabolomics in clinical lab practice etc.

About Jaipur

Jaipur, the largest city and the capital of Rajasthan, is also referred to as the Pink City. This place was India's first planned city and was founded by the ruler of Amber, Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II in 1727. With spectacular hilltops and stunning fortresses, Jaipur has become a major tourist attraction among both national and international tourists. This royal city captivates travellers as it is known for its rich culture and tradition, magnificent art and artefacts, and brilliant past. The serene temples, the long standing forts and palaces and beautiful havelis with royal touch to them; add on to the glory of Jaipur.

The most visited attractions of Jaipur are Amber Fort, Nahargarh Fort, Jaigarh Fort, Jal Mahal, Hawa Mahal, City Palace, Galta temple, Birla Temple, Govind dev ji temple and Albert hall museum.

Jaipur is in close proximity with two others important tourist destinations, Delhi and Agra; they form a “Golden Triangle” which is named against the distance to be travelled from one place to another.

Situated at a height of 431 metres above the sea level. There are various legends as, why Jaipur is known as the Pink city ,two of which are worth to mention. It was believed that the Prince of wales late Edward VII visited India in 1876 A.D. during the reign of Jai Singh. On his arrival he was accorded a warm welcome and the entire city was paved with pink Bajri or fine gravel thus giving it the name Pink City. Another theory is that Maharaja Jai Singh II was an ardent devotee of Lord Shiva. As terracotta is the favorite colour of the Lord he painted the entire city pink.

Jaipur has much to offer visitors, everything from pageants and festivals to extraordinarily clad people, a wealth of handicrafts, a royal legacy of palaces, and sightseeing that will occupy their time. However, should the visitors simply choose to walk around the streets of the old city instead, they will not regret it. All of Jaipur is an architectural gem and no scheduled sight- seeing can even hope to do justice to this mesmerizing city.



Local Sightseeing Excursion

Studded with spectacular hilltop forts and mesmerizing palatial residences, well laid gardens and wonders in stone, Jaipur is topped off with a sprinkling of heartwarming Rajasthani hospitality.

HAWA MAHAL, built in 1799, by Maharaja Sawai Pratap Singh, is the most recognizable monument of Jaipur. The 5 storied stunning semi-octagonal monument having 152 windows with over hanging latticed balconies is a fine piece of Rajput architecture. Originally designed for the royal ladies to watch and enjoy the processions and other activities, on the street below. Now it houses a well laid out museum. The display “Jaipur past and present” is the special feature of this newly setup museum.



CITY PALACES, situated in the heart of the old City, it occupies about one seventh of the old city area. The palace is a blend of Rajput and Mughal architecture, it houses a seven storeyed Chandra Mahal in the centre, which affords a fine view of the gardens and the city. Diwan-E-Aam (Hall of public audience) has intricate decorations and a unique collection of manuscripts, Diwan-E-Khas (Hall of private audience) has a marble pawed gallery. Mubarak Mahal has a rich collection of costumes and textiles. There is a Clock Tower near Mubarak Mahal. Sileh Khana has a collection of armory and weapons.

JAL MAHAL

This fascinating palace is located in the center of beautiful Man Sagar Lake. It's a testament to the luxury lifestyle of the Maharajas of this city





AMER FORT - The old capital of the Kachhwahas stands atop a range of craggy hills. The fort is remarkable as much for the majestic grandeur of its surroundings as for its sturdy battlements and beautiful palaces. It is a fine blend of Hindu and Muslim architecture. The solemn dignity of its red sandstone and white marble pavilions, when reflected in the lake at the foot hill, is a sight to behold. The original palace was built by Raja Man Singh, the additional extensions were built by Maharaja Mirja Raja Jai Singh and Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II, the last Maharaja of Amer.



JAIGARH FORT, standing on a hilltop, overlooking the palaces and city of Amer. The world's biggest cannon on wheels- the Jai Ban is positioned here, built during reign of Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II. It has a twenty feet long barrel and pumped in the cannon for a single shot.

(Jaipur - Agra - Delhi)

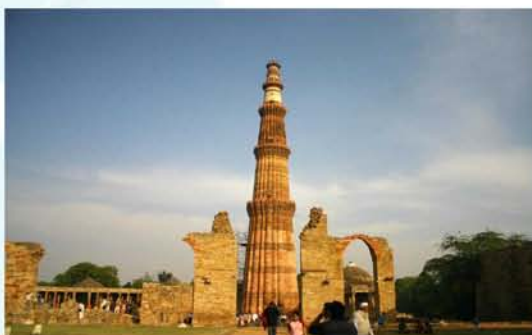
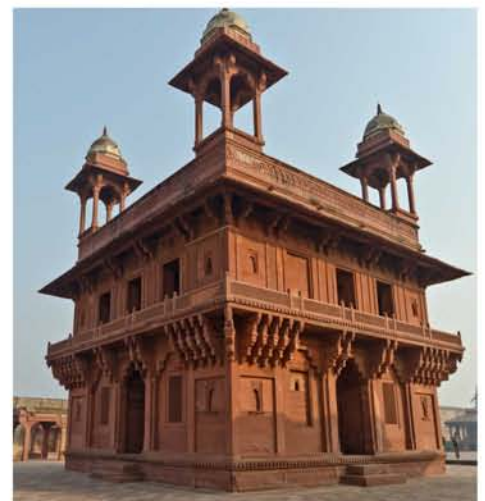


Day 01 Jaipur - Agra via Fatehpur Sikri (260 km - 6 hr)

Road trip to Agra, en route we will visit Fatehpur Sikri (Ghost Capital), the political capital of India's Mughal Empire under Akbar's reign, from the year 1571 until 1585, when it was abandoned, ostensibly due to lack of water. We will also visit Emperor Akbar's Residential complex and Mosque and Tomb of Salim Chisti. Thereafter we will continue our drive to Agra, situated on the banks of river Yamuna. Overnight stay at hotel.

Day 02 Agra - Delhi (220 km-5 hr) Half Day Tour

On the second day of our trip, we will visit the Taj Mahal, symbol of eternal love, which stands on the banks of River Yamuna. It was built by the 5th Mughal emperor, Shahjahan in the year 1631 in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. It was completed in 22 years. Overnight stay at hotel.



Day 03 Delhi

After breakfast, proceed for a full day city tour of New Delhi. Visit Qutab Minar, the tallest stone tower in India; visit Humayun's tomb, built in Indo Persian style and a predecessor to The Taj Mahal in Agra; India Gate – A War Memorial Arch. Also drive past the President's House, Parliament House, Government Secretariat Buildings and Connaught Place – the heart of New Delhi and a busy shopping centre. Later, move towards IGI airport for onward flight.

Rajasthan Tour (5 Nights/6 Days)

(Jaipur - Jodhpur - Chanoudgarh - Udaipur - Delhi)

Day 01 Jaipur - Jodhpur

After breakfast, check out and you will be driven to Jodhpur (320 kms / 6 hrs). Jodhpur, the second largest city in Rajasthan, lies at the entrance to the Thar Desert in a region called Marwar. The old city, founded in 1459, is surrounded by a 10 km long wall. Overnight stay at hotel.



Day 02 Jodhpur

Breakfast at the hotel. Later proceed for the city tour, visit the Meherangarh Fort, situated on a low sandstone hill. The palace apartments like Sukh Mahal, Phool Mahal, Sheesh Mahal etc are beautifully decorated and house jewellery, costumes, armory, palanquins, howdahs and other remnants of the past. Overnight stay at hotel.

Day 03 Jodhpur - Chanoud Garh

After breakfast, check out and you will be driven to Chanoud Garh. Overnight stay at hotel.

Day 04 Chanoud Garh - Udaipur

After breakfast at hotel, you will be driven to Udaipur (180 Kms / 4 hours), en route visit Ranakpur.

Day 05 Udaipur

Breakfast at the hotel. Later proceed for the sightseeing tour of Udaipur with the City Palace and Museum. The largest palace complex in India, it is a blend of Mughal and Rajput influences. Also see the 17th century Jagdish temple, drive around the Fatehsagar Lake, and visit the Sahelion ki Bari (the Garden for the Maids of Honour), an ornamental pleasure garden with fountains and marble kiosks. Later visit the Bharatiya Lok Kala Mandir or the Folk Art Museum. Overnight stay at hotel.

Day 6 Udaipur - Delhi

After breakfast at the hotel, check out and in time transfer to Udaipur Airport for flight to Delhi.
