

Scientific Presentations

Awards

The Special Interest Group on Pain in Childhood will be presenting two awards at the 11th International Symposium on Pediatric Pain and both awardees offer a plenary talk at the meeting.

- The Distinguished Career Award in Pediatric Pain is given to an individual who has dedicated their outstanding career to alleviating children's pain. The recipient is chosen by the SIG council, based on scientific contributions, teaching, and advocacy
- The Early Career Award in Pediatric Pain (formerly called Young Investigator Award) is chosen based on nominations to the SIG council.

There will also be four Best Trainee Poster Awards, selected from the Poster Abstracts submitted by trainee delegates. Recipients of the awards will be given a cash award of USD100 each and will be given 10 minutes each to present their posters during the conference.

The Scientific Committee welcomes the submission of Abstracts for Presentation. Delegates must submit Abstracts online at www.ispp2017.org

Please log on to our website for full details on how to submit abstract. The deadline for submission of abstracts is January 31, 2017

The IASP-SIG Pain in Childhood does not provide any remuneration for accepted Workshops or Poster abstracts.

Each author who submits an abstract that is accepted is required to register for the conference.

- The submitting author will receive notification by email indicating receipt of submission(s).
- The submitting author will receive notification of acceptance once reviewed by the Scientific Program Committee.
- Do not use proprietary drug names when referring to pharmacological substances. Only generic names of drugs are acceptable.
- Use only standard abbreviations. Place special or unusual abbreviations, in parentheses, after the full word appears the first time.
- Submissions may NOT describe a work-in-progress; they must describe final results and be in final format when submitting.
- Abstracts that do not conform to the prescribed structure will be rejected.

Abstracts must be submitted in English with accurate grammar and spelling of a quality suitable for publication. If you need help, please arrange for the review of your abstract by a colleague who is a native English speaker, by a university scientific publications office (or other similar facility) or by a copy editor, prior to submission.

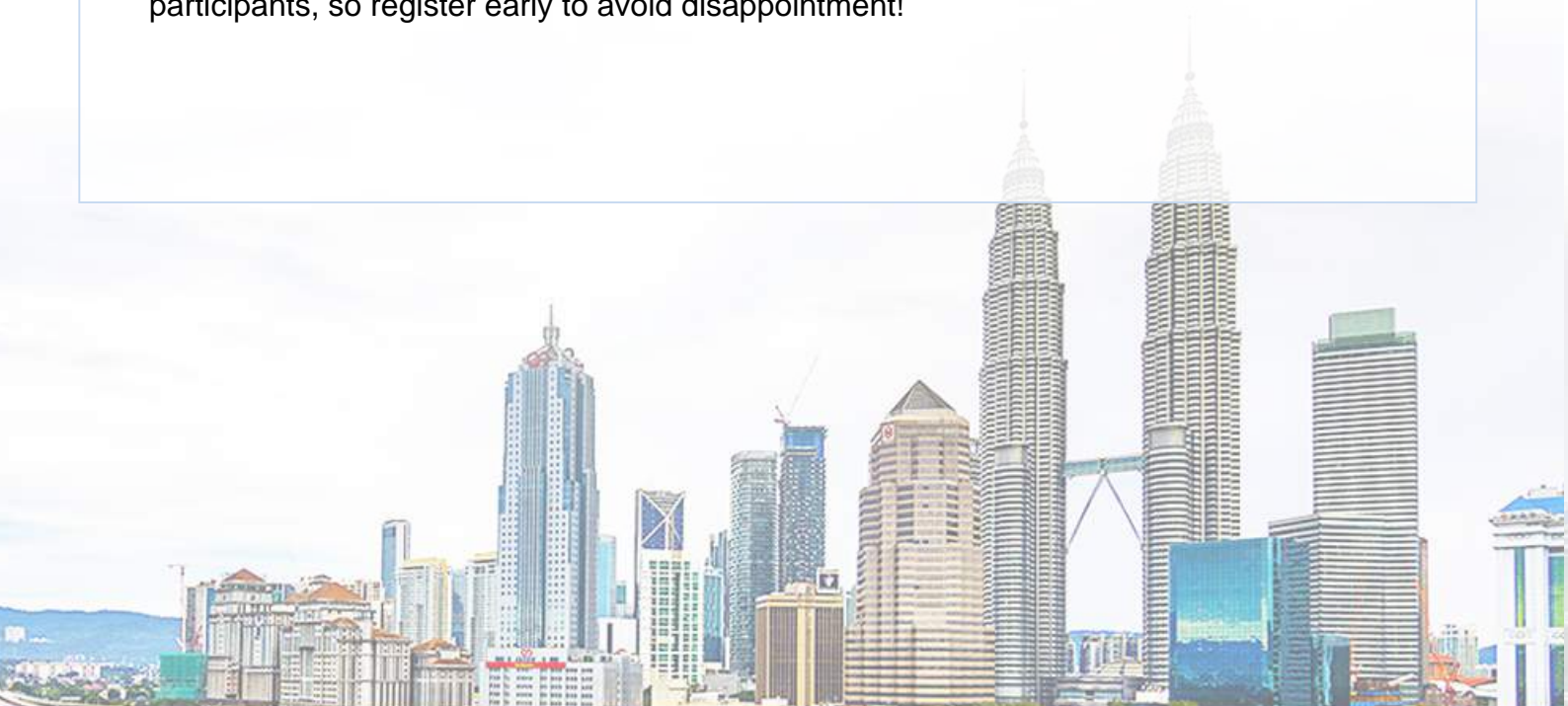

Criteria for selection are:

- Pediatric pain focused
- Made within the last 10 years
- English or in another language with English subtitles
- Of sufficiently good quality for presentation on screen
- Not previously shown at a previous ISPP Media presentation

A panel of Judges will view all submitted material to select those for screening. We have one hour for the Media Screening. The Judges will select the most interesting clips of various lengths from the DVD's chosen so that each clip will follow the next after a brief segment of black followed by title and credits of the following film. This will allow the maximum number of DVDs from around the world to be shared with the audience within that limited time frame.

The director need not be present, but someone representing the film should be in attendance at the screening to address questions in the Q&A period.

Format DVDs need to be in the Universal format able to be played in the North American format (NTSC) and the Asian/European format (PAL)


