#### **Reliance Electricity matters**

**Reliance Energy** has started approaching our members who have migrated to **Tata Power** with a promise of reducing the tariffs in the years to come. They are able to achieve through Appellate Tribunal Board against MERC's order for facilitating an increase in Cross Subsidy Surcharge. We are doing this so that we have multiple electricity service providers and we do not have to return to the old regime of monopoly of one single service provider.

#### Street Vendor policy

A new policy for Regularization of Street **Vendors** is in the process of implementation by the Central Government throughout the country. We are closely monitoring the developments and will put forth our objections if it is contrary to the Supreme Court judgment of banning cooking in the streets.
