Approval of accounts

Shri Nitin R Shetty, Hon. Treasurer presented the accounts of **AHAR** and Orchestra Bar for the month of September 2013.

The house unanimously approved the accounts

The President briefed the house that the **WP against the Minimum Wages Act** was admitted at Nagpur High Court and on 17.10.2013 has given an interim order that 70% of the Total Revised Minimum Wages can be paid to the employees. The next date of hearing is fixed on 25.11.2013. He said that one of the best Advocate, **Adv Vivek Thakur** was hired and so far an amount of **₹ 5, 04,000/-** has been spent towards the legal fees. The Managing Committee had approved an amount of **₹ 5, 00,000/-** for the purpose. He further said we need a further fund of

₹ 10, 00,000/- towards legal and other related expenditures for bringing the case to a logical end and get the result.

He requested the house to approve an additional amount of **₹ 10, 00,000/-** to meet the legal expenses of the Minimum Wages matter.

The house unanimously approved the same.

Events of the month

The President briefed as under

Minimum Wages

We met **Labour Minister Mr. Hassan Mush-riff** along with Labour Secretary and Labour Commissioner on 8.10.2013 and briefed about our grievances regarding the notification which is unjustified and unfair. We also represented that our genuine grievances addressed to the Labour Minister were not addressed. **Mr. Mush-riff** shown his inability as the notification is already out and he is helpless in the matter. We filed the WP in the name of **Nagpur Hotel Association** at the **Nagpur High Court** and during the first hearing we got an interim order to pay only 70% of the total Revised Minimum Wages. He requested the members to implement the order, but to keep the 30 per cent separately to fall back on in case of any reversal of order by the court in future. He said the next hearing is on 25.11.2013.

Service tax

The **Service Tax matter at Mumbai High Court** on 23.10.2013 was deferred. We had written to the **Commissioner of Service Tax** not to use any force for payment of Service tax as the matter is in court. Further, he advised all the members to get their establishment registered under Service Tax, if applicable.

process of revision, we have put in our suggestions for a reasonable hike and had met the **Minimum Wages Committee** for the same. Unfortunately, the current revision is quite contrary to the draft notification provided to us. We have already submitted our petition to the Labour Minister for a review of the same. We have also appointed **Adv. Vivek Thakur**, Senior Labour Counsel, from Nagpur bench of High Court. **M/s Haldiram of Nagpur** has agreed to support us by sharing the legal fees and **M/s Shreya Hotel, Pune**, has also shown interest in participation.

Reliance Electricity matters
Reliance Energy has started approaching our members who have migrated to **Tata Power** with a promise of reducing the tariffs in the years to come. They are able to achieve through higher **Cross Subsidy Surcharge and Wheeling Charges** for migrated consumers. We have taken a decision to challenge the same in the **Appellate Tribunal Board against MERC's** order for facilitating an increase in Cross Subsidy Surcharge. We are doing this so that we have multiple electricity service providers and we do not have to return to the old regime of monopoly of one single service provider.

Street Vendor policy
A new policy for Regularization of Street Vendors is in the process of implementation by the Central Government throughout the country. We are closely monitoring the developments and will put forth our objections if it is contrary to the Supreme Court judgment of banning cooking in the streets.

Insurance
As part of the promotion activities, one of the major achievements has been the Group Insurance Policy exclusively for **AHAR** members at competitive rates with **M/s R. K. Shetty & Co.** But it was not sustainable for our members to pay exorbitantly higher premium every year because of group dynamics and an increase in claims which affected every member. Hence, we have discontinued the present arrangement with **M/s R. K. Shetty & Co** and negotiated a better plan with **New India Assurance Company Ltd**, through **SREI Broking Company Private Limited**.

The **AGM** is scheduled on December 18, 2013. We seek the support of each and every hotelier in the same to make it a grand success.

Hon. Gen. Secretary

Briefed about three petitions and appeals against **MERC** orders and **BEST** in **Supreme Court** and **Appellate Board for Electricity**. While the matter pertaining to electricity and its providers is in court, the **MERC** should not have issued any order in favour of **Reliance Energy Limited (REL)**. We have already forwarded our points to **Adv. Shikha Ohri** and will be submitting our appeal in the appellate Board.

M/s Munjal Brothers due to a billing error on their part had put **M/s Sagar Bar & Restaurant, Mulund**, under **Embargo**. The Embargo was lifted due to the very firm approach on the part of the owner. We will be meeting the **BWMA** and the concerned Excise authorities regarding wrong imposition of embargo. He said in such cases the Permit Room hoteliers of that zone should boycott such traders and their products. This forces the traders to come for a compromise. He appreciated the efforts of **Shri Amar Shetty** in handling the issue. He also requested the members who had received the **TCS Notice from Tax Authorities** to forward the same to the **AHAR** office so that we can move in the matter against the vendors for non-payment of tax.

It is in our own interest to prevent the smuggling and bootlegging of spurious liquor. In the case of unjustified embargo , write to the Association. We will meet the higher authorities for redressal. Ask the distributors and vendors to provide the No Dues Certificates at the end of every financial year. Please do not sell liquor on dry days and also do not allow your staff to do so. In case you are found selling liquor on election and dry days, the FL-III License will be cancelled.
Publication	Shri Bhaskar Shetty	The AHAR Hospitality magazine has been released with maximum information and will reach the members within a day or two. Members are requested to provide sponsorship to the magazine through advertisements.
MCGM	Shri Niranjan Shetty	Please get your water tanks duly covered and also cleaned at regular intervals, as MCGMs authorities are inspecting them. You will be fined if they find any fault. In the ensuing renewal of MCGM licenses, ensure that the TRC is paid only once and not on every license. We are meeting the concerned authorities and are asking them to instruct all ward offices. A proposal has been put up by the legal department of MCGM for allowing the opening of Restaurants for 24 hours . Please support the move.
Orchestra Bar	Shri Bharat Thakur	I have been targeted and singled out by the police for fighting and getting the favourable verdict on Dance Bar case from the Supreme Court. I was booked under PITA and arrested for no fault of mine. We are moving Contempt of Court in the Supreme Court against the State Government and the matter will come on board within a week. I request all dance bar hoteliers to support us in this battle.

Shri Guruprasad Shetty	The present committee is doing a marvelous job. We have replaced the advocate in our case in the Supreme Court against BEST . We anticipate the hearing soon and are hoping for some relief. Thank you for the support given to me in the fight against unjustified electricity matters.

The FSSAI license expiring on 31.12.2013 should be renewed one month in advance. I.e. latest by November 30, 2013. Any default in payment will attract a penalty of Rs.100/- per day.

1 When the photocopies nomination paper are taken, duties and responsibilities on the overleaf are not taken.

2 Over writings are not correctly authenticated with full signature/s.

3 Alterations with white ink not permissible.

4 Forged signature will be viewed seriously and such nomination papers will be exposed in the AGM.

5 Hotel names are written without address.

6 Dates are not written.

7 A 50 per cent attendance is a must. In other

words, minimum of **06** attendances required.

● We met the representative of MWMA. Discussed about the **embargo, proposed loading and unloading charges**. We have received complaints from members that they have been served with **notice for non-payment of tax by SKOL**. We had communicated with the company and on 24.10.2013; the GM and Finance In charge of Sab Miller are coming to our office for clarification.

Ms. Jigna Shah briefed about the **necessity of voting** in the ensuing elections. She elaborated with AV how the various problems of inclusion, deletion, transfer of voters name can be affected. Replying to Shri Narayana M Alvas's query she said that a letter from the employer stating therein that the employee is working with them

Presentation

Shri Pradeep Jain	He thanked AHAR for the support and guidance from AHAR office bearers. He said that under the Electricity Act 2003 , a Regulatory Board is constituted in every State to help the consumers to get a qualitative electricity supply with reasonable and competitive rate. Any hike or revision in electricity charges should be approved by this board. In Maharashtra, it is MERC . If we are not happy with the decision of MERC , we can appeal in APTEL . APTEL has opened branches in Metros. However, due to rotation, the matter is coming up very slowly. Since last two years, we feel that MERC is favouring Reliance . We were able to get a stay in RIL matters. We have further challenged the hike in bills in APTEL which will have a hearing in November first week. The electricity fight is a long battle. We have solid grounds against the CSS &TDLR matters. We have to appoint reputed counsel to fight our cases in various Boards and Courts. The minimum fee per hearing is around ₹ 1,50,000/-. The members should understand that it is a fight for them and help AHAR with voluntary contributions.

Shailendra Shetty, VP, Zone – I	A Fire Officer was harassing and demanding huge favours in south Mumbai. In Gajanan Hotel matter, he demanded an amount of ₹ 1,20,000/- as bribe . We decided to fight against this harassment and got the officer trapped through ACB . Shri Shrinivas Shetty, Ex-VP and Shri J. D. Shetty played a major role. Any such harassment by any officials may be brought to the notice of AHAR and will be dealt accordingly.
Gangadhar Shetty, VP, Zone – II	Membership Fees of only 76 establishments are outstanding and it will be collected soon. The efforts of Shri Atif Soljar in removing the hawkers of his area are really appreciable.
Vijay Kumar Shetty, VP, Zone – V	Due to high hike in cost of all ingredients , the hoteliers were unable to cope up with the present rates. We took a corner meeting and marginally hiked the menu rates to help the hoteliers. The membership collection is on.
Sunil Patil, VP, Zone - VI	The harassment by the Special Squad of Additional Commissioner of Police, Eastern Region in various hoteliers of the zone is unabated. We are trying to meet the Addl. CP to discuss the same. The total membership collection till date is ₹ 4,70,000/-. We also had another Free Eye Check-up Camp .
Shivaji Shetty, VP, Zone – VIII	So far we have collected Membership Fees amounting to ₹ 1,61,000/-. We will collect the remaining membership fees at the earliest.
Sudhakar T Shetty, VP, Zone – IX	The trapping of the Fire Officer in bribe by ACB through efforts of AHAR has resulted in Fire Officers of other zone offering their support in any grievances. The total Membership Fees collection till date ₹ 4,26,000/-
Anil Salian, VP, Zone – X	A NGO, Grahak Seva Sanstha was trying to extort in Payal Hotel . We intervened and the matter was resolved. We had two Free Eye Check-up Camps and more than 300 employees benefitted. We have collected ₹ 4,00,000/- as Membership Fees .

A case of police matter of Shri Ramanna Shetty, Food Search , was attended and sorted out. The Special Squad constituted by the Addl. CP, Eastern Region is harassing the Permit Room Hoteliers. We will meet the Addl. CP to discuss the same. At the time of renewal of RC , the police are demanding the presence of the owner to confirm that he is alive. Please get the endorsement of timing upto 1.30 a.m. on your PPEL and Police RC to avoid any future complications.
Sukesh Shetty- Promotion	We are fighting numerous legal cases in various matters pertaining to the hotel industry. We further need at least ₹ 80 lakhs to complete the process and to get the desired results. The Membership Fees inspite of hike is not sufficient to meet this outflow. Promotion Committee is trying its best to bring maximum revenues through tie-ups, stalls etc. The members should support the products of the various stalls in our monthly meetings and AGM so that more and more vendors will attend and bring good revenue.
Bharat Thakur-Orchestra Bar	Our petition of Contempt of Court against the Home Minister of Maharashtra is coming up for hearing. In the submission at Supreme Court on 8.10.2013, the court directed the members to file individual Contempt of Court petition for quick disposal. We are doing the same. Our matter is on 25.10.2013 at Supreme Court. The Dance Bar hoteliers should be aware of the happenings, which is only possible through participation in various meetings.
Nikhil Shetty - FSSAI	If any member has any case regarding Neon Glow Sign Board , please forward it to AHAR . We will take it as test case.
K. K. Mahale - Hawkers Action	We should have a positive mind set while fighting hawkers's case . We should try to include our Association in the Trade Vendors Committee to be formed by the MCGM. We are moving court after Diwali after studying the newly introduced Street Vendor Policy .
