Abstract for Case Studies

DEADLINE: 31 May 2017

We welcome the submission of insightful case studies. Case studies must illustrate the value of diet and lifestyle intervention in the understanding, prevention and/or management of diseases. It will be good to include pre- and post-intervention data.

Abstracts describing case studies should be comprised of the following sections: Client History, Assessment including food nutrition history, Nutrition Diagnosis, Dietary Prescription and Intervention, Monitoring and Evaluation, Summary, and Disclosure Statement (sponsors, conflict of interest, if any). One or two figures may be used, but the author(s) must ensure that the figures are legible when they are reduced to half size.

Case studies abstracts should not exceed 350 words in Times New Roman 12 font.
