President Er. R. K. Aggarwal gave his opening speech welcoming his Industry friends and colleagues for making this day so vibrant and requested for fullest support to PVI-2017. This was followed by Lighting of auspicious lamp in benign hands of President, Chairman GC Mr. Arvind Mehta, Chairman NAB-2017 Mr Raju Desai, VP Finance Mr Jagat Killawala,

The post lunch session featured presentations of various sub committees. From Ground committee to



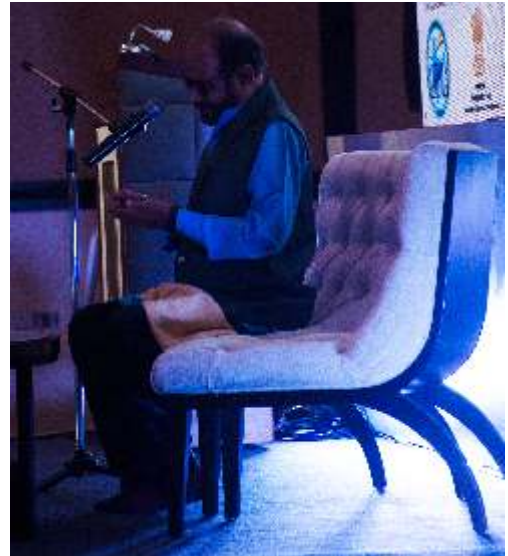
