Dear Member,

*Greetings & Wishes for a Happy New Year & Pongal  
from the desk of Secretary!*

I am immensely pleased to welcome you to the 30<sup>th</sup> Annual congress of the southern chapter of ISN being held in the historic city of Pondicherry. The seeds of this meeting were sown during the Mysore conference when I realised that the City had never hosted a southern chapter meet. Dr Murugesan as we know him, is a self effacing gentleman who has done pioneering work in Pondy for well over 3 decades. Though hesitant to take up the responsibility at first, he agreed later and immediately set in to motion preparations for a Conference which I am sure will go down in the annals of southern chapter as one of the most memorable events. Standing shoulder to shoulder with Dr. Murugesan during the whole exercise was Dr. Gopal Rabindranath, whose enthusiasm and energy are infectious.

To circumvent this, I have requested the Scientific committee Chairs (Prof. MSP and Prof. Kasi) to go through the abstracts and award 75 marks for the scientific content beforehand. The remaining 25 marks will be awarded on the day by the respective chair persons for presentation and discussion. I am sure that the model will be acceptable to all of you.

On the social front I am sure the family members of the delegates will be kept enthralled by a variety of sight seeing and entertainment programmes in and around Pondicherry.

Nominations have been received for the following positions: Vice-President - Dr Dhinakaran (Madurai) and Dr Sree Bhush Raju (Hyderabad), Secretary - Dr. Suresh (Chennai) and Treasurer - Dr. Ram Rapur (Hyderabad). I wish all the very best for the incoming team of office bearers.

On a personal note I thank each one of you for your kind and co operation during my tenure as the Honorary Secretary of ISNSC. It was satisfying to see the birth and growth of the bi-annual Newsletter. The unfailing support of seniors was always there when I wanted it and I am grateful. I am sure that this society will reach greater heights of scientific pursuit in the coming years. Before I sign off, I must tell you that these few years have been the most memorable and satisfying in my professional career.

I look forward to meeting each one of you during the conference.

## BIKETHON RALLY FOR AWARENESS ABOUT ORGAN DONATION

"Rally for Life" - the motorbike rally, organised by MOHAN Foundation (Multi Organ Harvesting Aid Network), to promote organ donation awareness was flagged off on 09.09.09 at 09:09:09 am by Thiru T. Rajendran IPS, Commissioner of Police, from Loyola College, Chennai. The day was unique and so was the theme - ONE organ donor can save NINE lives.

The reason for undertaking this rally was the spurt in organ donation activity in the state from October 2008 - 109 organs from 36 deceased donors over a period of nine months. The six rally members, young men in their 20s working in

different corporates have been friends since school. They wanted to make a difference to society through their humanitarian work and expressed their willingness to undertake the 2000 km rally on their motorbikes. The rally covered nine major locations in Tamil Nadu - Vellore, Salem, Coimbatore, Madurai, Tirunelveli, Dindigul, Trichy, Thanjavur - and Pondicherry. At each of these locations, a function was held to felicitate organ donor families in that area. The enthusiasm and the meticulous organisation by the hosts (doctors and hospitals) in each of the locations ensured that the rally went through in a seamless fashion.

The closing ceremony of "Rally for Life" was held on 20th September 2009, but it marked the beginning of another campaign - a campaign to include the 'clause of organ donation on the driving license.' With 80,000 deaths on the road and almost 40,000 of them being by death annually, this simple inclusion on our driving license has the power to save many lives and wipe away all the shortage of organs. The special guests of the day were Mr. Syed Munir Hoda, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Govt. of Tamil Nadu, Mr. S. Machendranathan, IAS, Transport Commissioner and popular Cine Actress and Social Activist, Ms. Revathy Menon. The highlight of the event was that 2500 signatures were handed over by Ms. Revathy Menon to Mr. Machendranathan supporting a request to incorporate an organ donation clause in the license.

The "Rally for Life" marked the coming together of doctors, hospitals, NGOs, corporates, and individuals from different walks of life to endorse a campaign that is priceless and invaluable - the gift of life.
