

Best Young Investigator Award: Developing Country (Clincial)

I thank the Indian society Of Nephrology Southern Chapter to have given me this opportunity to share our work at Andhra Medical College for which I was awarded as Young Nephrologist from Developing Country at World Congress Nephrology, Hong Kong 2013. The title of my abstract is "COMPLICATED MALARIA AKI COMPARING PERITONEAL DIALYSIS VS HEMODIALYSIS". As we know PD is the common modality of renal replacement therapy for Acute Kidney Injury in developing countries like India. It is cheaper , efficient and as effective as

hemodialysis.In our study we tried to compare Peritoneal dialysis with Hemodialysis in Acute kidney injury due to Complicated falciparum malaria.

We studied 363 pt with AKI due to Complicated Malaria. We excluded patients who were seriously ill requiring ionotrope support or in impending respiratory failure. Patients were divided into 2 groups PD group and HD group. In the PD group the patients were given peritoneal dialysis which lasted for 60 hrs maximum, using stiff PD catheter. In HD group pts received HD for 1 -4 sessions over a weeks time. Baseline

serum creatinine and Blood urea were taken and reassessed every 24-48hrs and the at the end of one week. The results showed that both the modalities were comparable at the end one week in view of renal recovery.

In our study we saw that in hemodynamically stable cases PD is comparable to HD.Hence PD can be suggested as a first line modality of renal replacement therapy in Complicated

malaria AKI as it is cheaper, effective and easy to practice.

Best Poster award at Satellite meeting of Committee on Kidney Health for Disadvantaged Population: WCN 2013

Dr Manisha Sahay, Professor and Head, Department of Nephrology. Osmania Medical College and General Hospital, Hyderabad wins the Overall best paper award at the Satellite Conference for Disadvantaged Population at the World Congress of Nephrology. Hongkong, 2013. Dr Sahay is a member of Young Nephrologist Committee of International Society of Nephrology.

Her paper entitled AKI in Leptospirosis highlighted the infection related acute kidney injury in a tropical country with specific emphasis on Leptospira related AKI. She analysed the clinicopathological correlation in Leptospirosis AKI and focused on the determinants of outcome. Leptospirosis is an important zoonotic disease in Southern India and causes significant renal morbidity. This is an ongoing study which aims to determine the poor prognostic markers in Leptospirosis AKI and measures to improve outcome.

Dr Manisha Sahay expresses her gratitude to the Indian Society of Nephrology- Southern chapter and ISN, India for their constant encouragement and support without which this would not have been possible.

Best Poster Award at ISN Research & Prevention Program Poster session, WCN 2013

Dr Arpana Iyengar, Additional Professor, Department of Pediatric Nephrology, St John's Medical College Hospital, Bangalore received the best poster award under the ISN Research and Prevention Program at the World Congress Nephrology Conference and an award for the best paper presentation from a developing country, at the Satellite conference of the World Congress of Nephrology, Hong Kong, 31st May to 5th June 2013.

Her research paper titled "Are low birth weight newborns at risk of suboptimal renal growth and function during infancy?" deals with the issue of the influence of intrauterine growth restriction and prematurity on renal growth and function from birth to 18 months of age. The future plan is to track the renal growth and function of this established cohort of infants through childhood and adolescence.
