## GIST OF THE 1<sup>ST</sup> CASE

A 59 year old male in excellent condition suffering from epigastric pain and weight loss for 2 months.

- Gastroscopy (April 2020): lesion at the distal part of the esophagus (35-40 cm from dental arches), developed on Barrett esophagus.
- Biopsy: adenocarcinoma, HER-2 negative.
- Staging with thoraco-abdominal PET Scan and echo-endoscopy: no metastatic disease.
- Neoadjuvant treatment (CROSS protocol), May June 2020.
- New staging with PET-Scan and Liver MRI: two liver metastases.

## GIST OF THE 2<sup>ND</sup> CASE

A 58 year old male with tobacco use, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and sleep apnea. Dysphagia and hematemeses.

- Gastroscopy (April 2021): lesion at the distal part of the esophagus (38-42 cm from dental arches).
- Echo-endoscopy staging: uT3 N2.
- Biopsy: adenocarcinoma, HER-2 negative.
- Staging with thoraco-abdominal PET Scan: 4 liver metastases.
- Systemic chemotherapy (FLOT protocol), May June 2021.
- New staging with PET-Scan and Liver MRI: regression of liver metastases.

Discussion: Management of oligo metastases.
