Refractory GERD in Systemic Sclerosis with CREST syndrome. Can we do more, or nothing more?

Presentation of the case: Prof. Yeong Yeh Lee

GIST OF THE CASE

Case:

A 60 year old lady with diffuse systemic sclerosis and CREST syndrome, suffering from refractory dysphagia. Surgery is considered.

- Upper endoscopy performed in 2017 showed erosive esophagitis and hiatal hernia. Similar findings at endoscopy performed in 2022.
- High Resolution Manometry in 2017 showed hypotensive LES hincter with aperistaltic esophagus. Similar findings at manometry performed in 2022.
- Recent worsening of symptoms despite Esomeprazole 40 mg BID and Itppride 50 mg TID.
- Fundoplication is considered for this patient.

Discussion points:

- Are symptoms attributed to GERD or dysmotility associated with CREST?
- Is there any role for medical therapy to slow down progression or to treat refractory symptoms?
- What are the indications for surgery?
