Registration

Eleven Pilot Centers worldwide, committed by the signatory of an Agreement, are currently listed in the network of the OESO-SEMPIRE Platform of Excellence in Esophagology.

They have responded positively to the proposal to take part in the project of the **Virtual Educational Channel** in Esophagology, an idea born out of the new constraints imposed in all countries by the Covid19 pandemic.



Each month, one of the Pilot Centers of the network of the Platform offers members of the international scientific community the opportunity to participate, from anywhere in the world, in the" staff meeting" of a Virtual Department that brings together several specialists from different disciplines around a clinical case of a patient.

Such a program is in line with true multi-disciplinarity, the essence of OESO since its creation, and of the mission defined by UNESCO in the **Chair of Digital Education** attributed in 2018, in the University of Geneva, to the OESO Foundation.



The first "staff meeting discussion" was organized on May 28 by the Pilot Center of Excellence in Milan, led by Professor Luigi Bonavina with a prestigious panel (see www.oeso.org).

Connections made from 40 countries showed the great didactic interest of such approaches to diagnosis and treatments.

This success makes it possible to consider the **Virtual Educational Channel** now in place as an instrument of considerable educational value.



The second clinical case of the Platform will be presented as part of the Esophageal Program at Stanford University.
