
Esophagectomy in patients with esophageal stent in-situ

GIST OF THE CASE

Presenters of the case:

- Russell E. White
- Yonas Ademe Teferi

- A 50 years old male
- Moderately differentiated SCC of the esophagus
- Received neoadjuvant chemo-radiotherapy (in clinical and radiological remission at the time of surgery)
- Esophageal Self-Expanding Metallic Stent (SEMS) placed 10 months prior to surgery for nutritional rehabilitation
- Underwent three-field esophagectomy
- Developed gastric conduit leak post-op (successfully managed endoscopically with SEMS)
