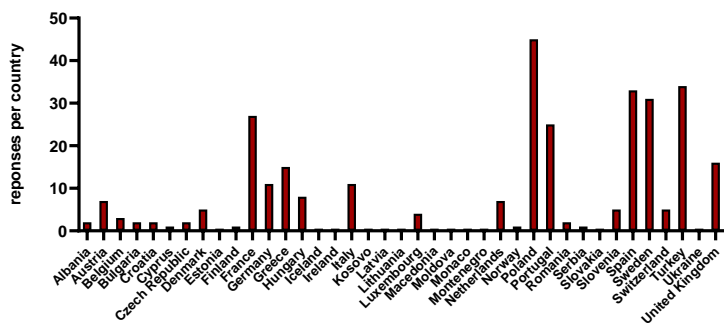

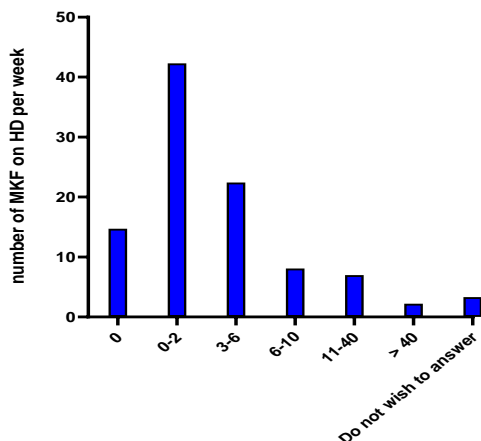

378 individual nephrologist responses across 29 countries

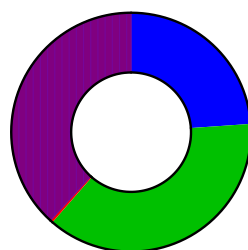

How many migrant patients receive chronic dialysis in your facility every week?



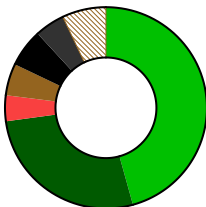
Concerning the legal rights of migrant patients for dialysis:

no clear directives from GB or hospital direction

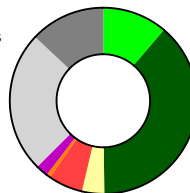

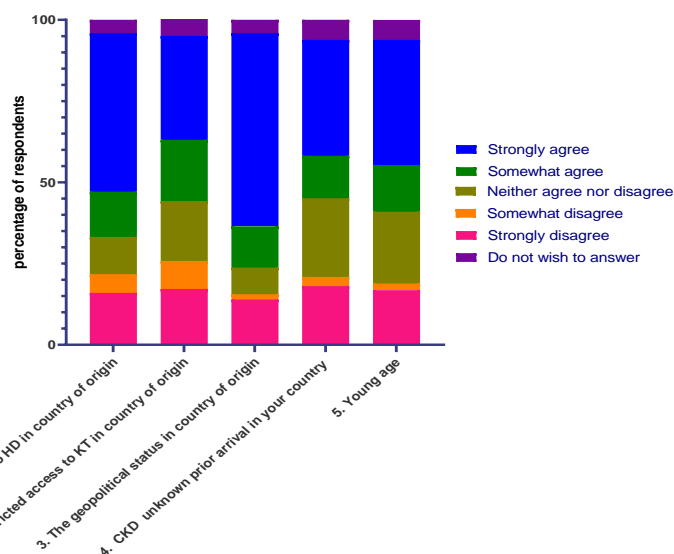
Under which conditions may migrant patients with kidney disease receive coverage for kidney transplantation?



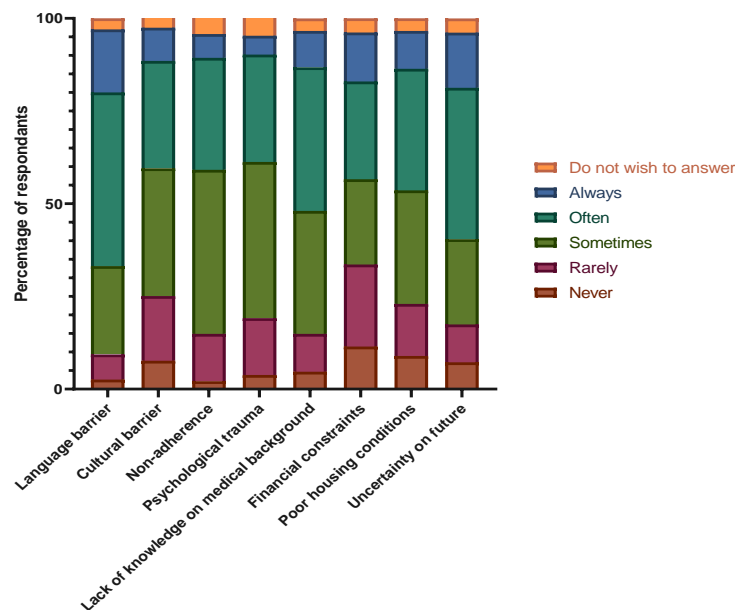
Both living and deceased KT covered with MHI, regardless of MKF status
