Take a afternoon flight for Goa via Mumbai.

Flight- AI 612 @1355 Hours from Jaipur reaches Mumbai @ 1535 Hours AI 661 @1650 Hours from Mumbai reaches Goa @ 1800 Hours

On arrival at Goa, Transfer to hotel and check-in at hotel.

The smallest state of India, Goa is famous for its Portuguese churches, beautiful sandy beaches and lovely markets. Though the city has a modern outlook; the history of Goa dates back to 8000- 6000 BC. Goa has a huge biodiversity. Goa's wildlife sanctuaries boast of more than 1512 documented species of plants, over 275 species of birds, over 48 kinds of animals and over 60 genera of reptiles.

The town has preserved its Portuguese heritage remarkably well and parts of it still consist of narrow winding streets, old houses with over hanging balconies, red-tiled roofs and numerous small bars and cafes which is know as Latin Quarters.

At the Spice Plantation you can experience the thrill of watching a Kingfisher dive for his catch. You will also enjoy watching the monkeys as they frolic on the trees.
