Australian Trusted Trader



- Established in 2015
- Launched in 2016
- Australia's Authorised Economic Operator
- Membership of the Australian Trusted Trader program is free to Australian businesses that can demonstrate a secure supply chain and high levels of trade compliance.
- Once accredited, businesses have access to a range of benefits that simplify their customs processes.

Australia's ATT Status

- As of 1 April 2024 ATT has 922 accredited businesses in a variety of industries
 - Around 60 per cent are small to medium enterprises
- ATT accredits businesses against international supply chain standards set by the WCO
- Australia currently has 9 MRA partners
 - AEO's receive trade facilitation benefits at the border of MRA partners
 - MRAs will provide Trusted Traders an estimated benefit of \$2.8 billion over 2015-2025



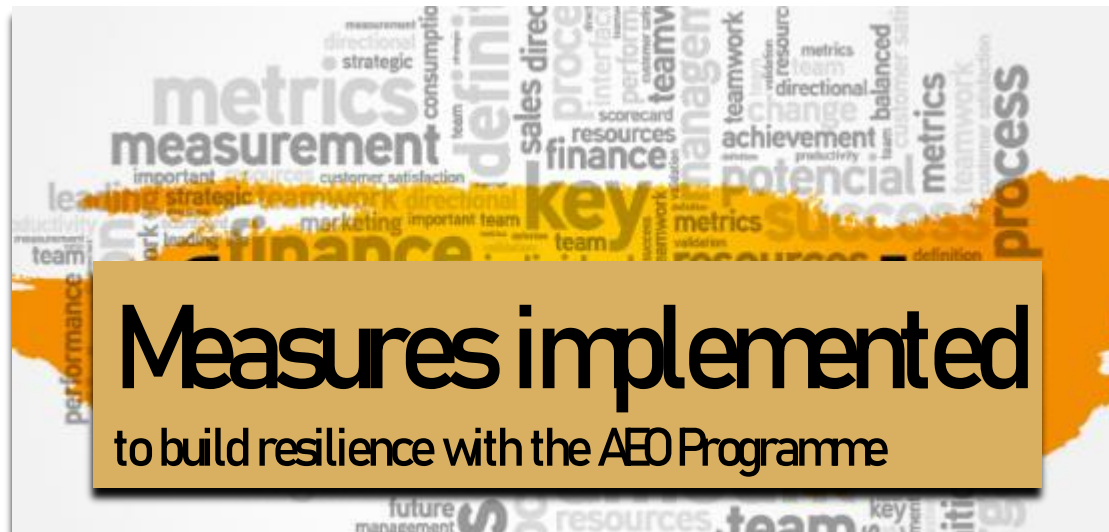
