2. 1949 International Driving Permits are valid for one year from their date of issue. However, the state in which the visitor is driving may limit the period during which an International Driving Permit is recongnized for each visit of that state. In any case, the length of the visitor's stay is determined by the validity of his visa or authorized length of stay as a visitor
