First Private Master of ORL-HNS Programme in Malaysia a Success

A significant milestone in the history of ENT training in Malaysia was achieved when the first private Master of ORL-HNS programme was approved by the Ministry of Higher Education in November 2012. The Master of ORL-HNS, proposed by KPJ Healthcare University College (KPJUC), was approved with the support of Department of ORL-HNS Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, the Conjoint Board of ORL-HNS and the National Conjoint Board. It received accreditation and approval by the Malaysian Qualification Agency and Ministry of Higher Education. History was created when the first two candidates in the programme passed the Final Conjoint Part II examination with flying colours (picture). The examination was held at Universiti Sains Malaysia in November 2016. These first two graduates received their degree from UKM.

The hallmark of the training programme is 'one-to-one', hands-on apprenticeship, where each master's trainee (resident) is supervised by one consultant. Residents will be supervised by experienced KPJ consultants on a three to six monthly rotation. In the early part of the training, residents are introduced to basic skills for outpatient assessment, care of inpatients and basic specialty procedures. As the residents gain experience and becomes more proficient they will be allowed to progress in level of supervised clinical skills learning opportunities. Residents can evaluate inpatient and emergency conditions under the supervision of consultants. In the operating room, residents are always supervised, but allowed to become more independent in decision making and performance of procedures as their skills evolve, guided by immediate formative feedback by the consultants. As residents gain further patient care and clinical skills experience, they will progress in responsibility to one of 'supervised independence', where the supervising consultant is always in the care of every patient and has ultimate responsibility. Residents in the KPJUC Masters programme also do three-monthly posting at UKM Medical Centre and Department of ORL-HNS, Ministry of Health hospitals in Alor Setar, Kota Bharu, Melaka, Selayang and Hospital Kuala Lumpur.

This private Master of ORL-HNS programme at KPJUC proves that through innovative training structure, and close cooperation from Department of ORL-HNS UKM and KKM hospitals, private ENT surgeons in KPJ hospitals are capable of contributing to quality training and education. This close collaboration between the public and private sector in training the next generation of ENT surgeons is the pride of our ENT Society. Thank you to Professor (C) Dr Primuharsa Putra (Programme Director), Professor (C) Dr Aminuddin Saim, Associate Professor (C) Dato' Dr Mohd Solahuddin Mohd Kenali, Dr Muhammad Hazim Mohd Yusof Senusi, Associate Professor (C) Dr Roslan Mahmud, Dr Ridzo Mahmud, Associate Professor (C) Dr Vijay Soni and Associate Professor (C) Dr Mazita Ami from KPJ group of hospitals who have devoted their time as trainers and supervisors in the programme, despite their busy clinical work. Currently, five more residents are in the programme.

18th Asian Research Symposum on Rhinology ARSR 8th Malaysian International Congress of Otorhinolaryngology 36th Annual General Meeting of the MSO-HNS

The 18th Asian Research Symposium on Rhinology, 8th Malaysian International Congress of Otorhinolaryngology 36th of Malaysian and AGM Society of Otorhinolaryngologist - Head & Neck Surgeons was held on 26th to 28th May 2016 at the Shangri-La Hotel, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. This is the second time that the ARSR was hosted in our country the last being in 2007. There was an overwhelming participation not only from within the country but from our neighbouring countries and even from as far Europe, America and the Far East.

For the first time, we were allowed to bring cadaveric specimens into the hotel and conducted life demonstrations on various new state-of-the-art techniques which were done by experts like Professors Heinz Stammberger, N. Ahilasamy, Demir Bajin, Nishit Shah and our own N Prepagaran among others. The meeting itself hosted a myriad of topics covering the width and depth of ENT; however emphasis was given to topics related to rhinology, skull base and allergy. Controversial topics were addressed in highly charged expert panel discussions and also in the form of debates. This is a paradigm shift from the conventional way our conferences are conducted which is based on lectures and question and answer sessions.

The participation of the meeting was good with almost 500 participants and there was fantastic support from the industry where there was close to 50 industry partners who helped make this meeting possible. There were even companies from South Korea, India and China as well together with our local distributors.

We were privileged to host the Malaysian- Singapore Meeting this time with many of the young residents presenting research of truly high quality. The winner was Dr Tan Shi Nee a Malaysian candidate from KPJ University. As always the highlight was our Gala Dinner and the installation of the new President and the awards ceremony. Two women were the recipients at the Dinner namely Dato' Dr Pua Kin Choo and Dato' Dr Siti Sabzah both outstanding ladies and strong stalwarts of the Society. This was also the first time an award was presented posthumously to Prof Dr KN Subramaniam who had served tirelessly in his time as Hon Secretary of the Society.

All in all, I would consider this event to be hugely successful on which the tradition of conducting high quality scientific meeting was upheld since its inception in 2009. We look forward to playing host in many international meetings in the future.



2nd Kedah Paediatric Otology Audiology Update 2016 (in conjunction with ORL and Audiology Service Meeting 2016, Ministry of Health Malaysia) 6th & 7th November 2016, Hotel and Convention Centre, Alor Setar, Kedah Darulaman

This was a two-day event organised by the Department of ORL, Head and Neck Surgery, Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah under the ORL, Audiology and Speech Education Society - OASES in conjunction with the National ORL & Audiology Service Meeting of Ministry of Health Malaysia for the year 2016. It involved a series of lectures and panel discussions the Paediatric Otolaryngologists, Otologists, from Audiologists, Paediatrician, Child Psychiatrist, Paediatric Neuroradiologist, Speech Language Pathologist and Family Physician from Ministry of Health and Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia. It enlightened the importance of early detection of paediatric ear diseases and hearing loss including children with special needs, in order to escalate early intervention and hearing rehabilitation, thus ensuring appropriate language development, learning skills and improved quality of life of these children. USM Tracheostomy and Pediatric Airway Workshop 2016

The first day of the workshop was targeted at participants such as the medical officers and the paramedics who were directly involved in managing tracheostomized patients. The lectures were mainly focused on pertinent matters and issues regarding the tracheostomy care. The participants also had the opportunity to do hands-on tracheostomy care on the mannequins. The second day of the workshop focused on the pediatric airway problem and its management. It includes a series of lectures by distinguished invited speakers and hands-on sessions on the anaesthetized rabbits. The distinguished speakers among others were Dato' Dr Siti Sabzah from Hospital Sultanah Bahiyyah and Dr Hashimah Ismail from Hospital Raja Perempuan Zainab II, Kota Bharu, Kelantan.



USM International Endoscopic Sinus Surgery FESS Course & Workshop 2017

Distinguished speakers from local; Associate Professor Dr Tang Ing Ping, Mr Rosdi Ramli, Mr Rosli Mohd Nor and international speakers, Dr David Chin from Singapore and Dr Budi Sutikno from Indonesia shared their knowledge and experiences in the sinus surgery. Besides a whole day lectures by our distinguished speakers, the workshop also included a live surgery session for FESS followed by a hands-on cadaveric dissection. Equipped with the high definition monitor and IGS monitoring systems for each cadaver, we provide one of the best set-up for cadaveric dissection with our fresh specimens. A heartfelt gratitude to all the members from ORL-HNS Department USM who were involved in organising the workshop and making it a very successful event. At the end of the session, we received positive feedbacks from the participants. We intend to do this workshop every year.





UKMMC Total Laryngectomy and Neck Dissection Cadaveric Dissection Workshop 2017

On the 7th March 2017, the UKMMC Total Laryngectomy and Neck Dissection Cadaveric Dissection Workshop took place in the Microsurgery Lab of the ENT Department UKMMC. A total of 21 postgraduate students registered for the one-day workshop. The moderators for the workshop included Professor Dato' Dr Abdullah Sani, Professor Dr Marina Mat Baki, Mr Mohd Razif Mohamad Yunus and Associate Professor Dr Mawaddah Azman. Fresh human head and neck cadavers were used for the workshop. The postgraduate students learnt the landmarks involved in neck dissection, parotidectomy, submandibulectomy and were able to perform laryngectomy. It was a fruitful workshop for the postgraduate students. The moderators too had a rejoiceful moment sharing experiences performing these surgeries. The organisers are very thankful for the kind participation of the moderators involved and hope for successful similar workshops in the future.



11th Laryngology and Phonosurgery Workshop, 2017

The 11th Laryngology and Phonosurgery workshop, organised by the Department of Otorhinolaryngology, UKM Medical Centre, was successfully held on 11th until 13th of January 2017. The 3-day workshop enabled participants to learn and

understand more about laryngeal disorders and the surgical treatments as well as the upper airway obstruction caused by the bilateral vocal fold immobility. Distinguished speakers, Professor Dr Abdullah Sani Mohamed, Professor Dr Marina Mat Baki, Associate Professor Dr Mawaddah Azman and Dr Masaany Mansor shared their knowledge and experience. The course incorporated lectures and live operative sessions, demonstration of office based injection laryngoplasty and laryngeal cadaveric hands-on to learn and practise various surgical treatments for laryngeal disorders. There were 67 participants from Malaysia, Myanmar and Indonesia.





The USM Audiology Intensive Course for ORL-HNS MMED Candidates 2017

Audiology and Speech Pathology Programme, School of Health Sciences, was proud to organise the Audiology Intensive Course for the ORL-HNS MMED candidates for the third consecutive year. It was held at the Tutorial Room A, School of Medical Sciences from 5th to 6th April 2017. It was attended by the third and fourth year MMED candidates of ORL-HNS. This course was started in 2014 as an addition to the ORL-HNS compulsory intensive course held yearly. It is well known

that audiology is an important topic to learn as part of the otology section. However, due to time constraint it is unable to be fully covered during the five days ORL-HNS intensive course. Hence, we saw the need to address this issue and with the collaboration with the audiology lecturers from Audiology and Speech Pathology Programme, and the ORL-HNS surgeons from the ORL-HNS department, the Audiology intensive course was designed to provide the essential knowledge of clinical audiology and the integration of the audiologic tests results. This will lead to effective management of patients when there is mutual understanding between the ORL surgeons and audiologists. 1st International Masterclass on Vestibular Assessment and Management

Balance Unit, Audiology & Speech Pathology Program was proud to organise the first International Masterclass on Vestibular Assessment and Management on the 13th and 14th March 2017 at the Bluewave Hotel, Shah Alam, Selangor. The event was officiated by the Deputy Dean (Student Affairs and Network) from School of Medical Sciences, USM, Professor Dr Din Suhaimi Sidek. The international speakers were Professor Dr Anirban Biswas, a well-known neurotologist from Kolkata, and Dr Michelle Petrak, the Director of Clinical Audiology from Interacoustics. The local speakers were Professor Dr Din Suhaimi Sidek, Dr Philip Rajan, Dr Mohd Normani Zakaria and Dr Zuraida Zainun. This event was made possible by

the collaboration from USAINS and the sponsors. The total numbers of participants were 106 from Malaysia and Singapore. The majority of the participants were physiotherapists, followed by audiologists and the medical officers and specialists of ORL-HNS. The main aim of this masterclass was to enhance the knowledge on the clinical vestibular assessment and management, with the emphasis on the latest update on BPPV. Participants were also introduced to the *Bal* Ex innovation products for vestibular rehabilitation. The second and third vestibular masterclass will be held in Bandung, Indonesia and USM Health Campus respectively.



1st ENT Course in Pharmacy 2016

Kuala Lumpur, 4th September 2016 - To further strengthen Science for a Better Life, Bayer Consumer Health was the first to pioneer a collaboration with Malaysian Society of Otorhinolaryngologists - Head and Neck Surgeons (MSO-HNS) and Malaysian Pharmaceutical Society (MPS) to organise the 1st ENT Course in Pharmacy. This CME activity was successfully held at the Le Meridien Hotel, Kuala Lumpur to educate pharmacists on how to deal with ENT cases with the hopes that this can improve patient management and care.

A total of more than 90 pharmacists from Klang Valley attended the full day programme on ENT topics. There were a total of 9 ENT speakers plus a MPS speaker who deliberated over various topics including common ENT problems for example; allergic rhinitis, sinusitis, sore throat, vertigo and the role of pharmacist in educating patients. Six CPD points were awarded for MPS members.



2nd ENT Course in Pharmacy 2017

Penang, 26th March 2017 - To continue the momentum from the 1st ENT Course in Pharmacy held in Kuala Lumpur, Bayer Consumer Health together with MSO-HNS decided to continue with the series of ENT courses for pharmacists.
