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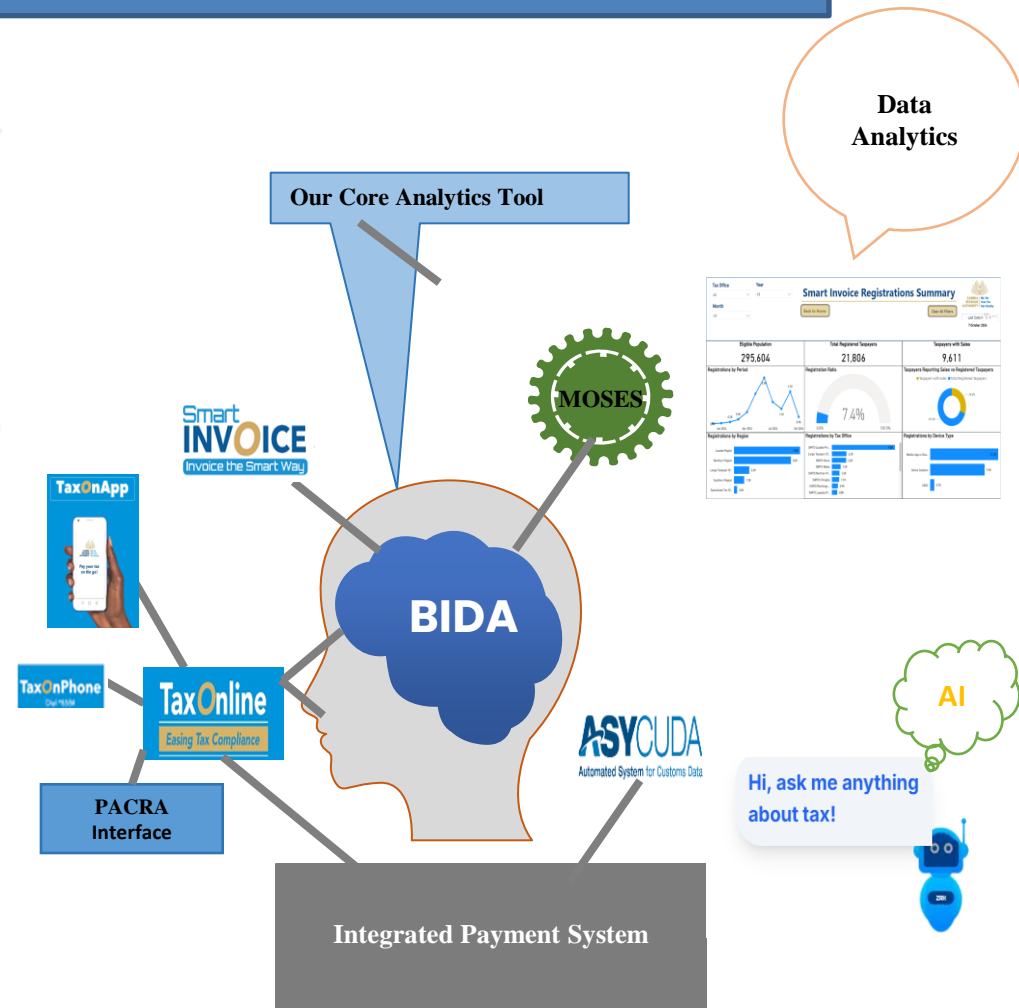
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Introduction (1/2)

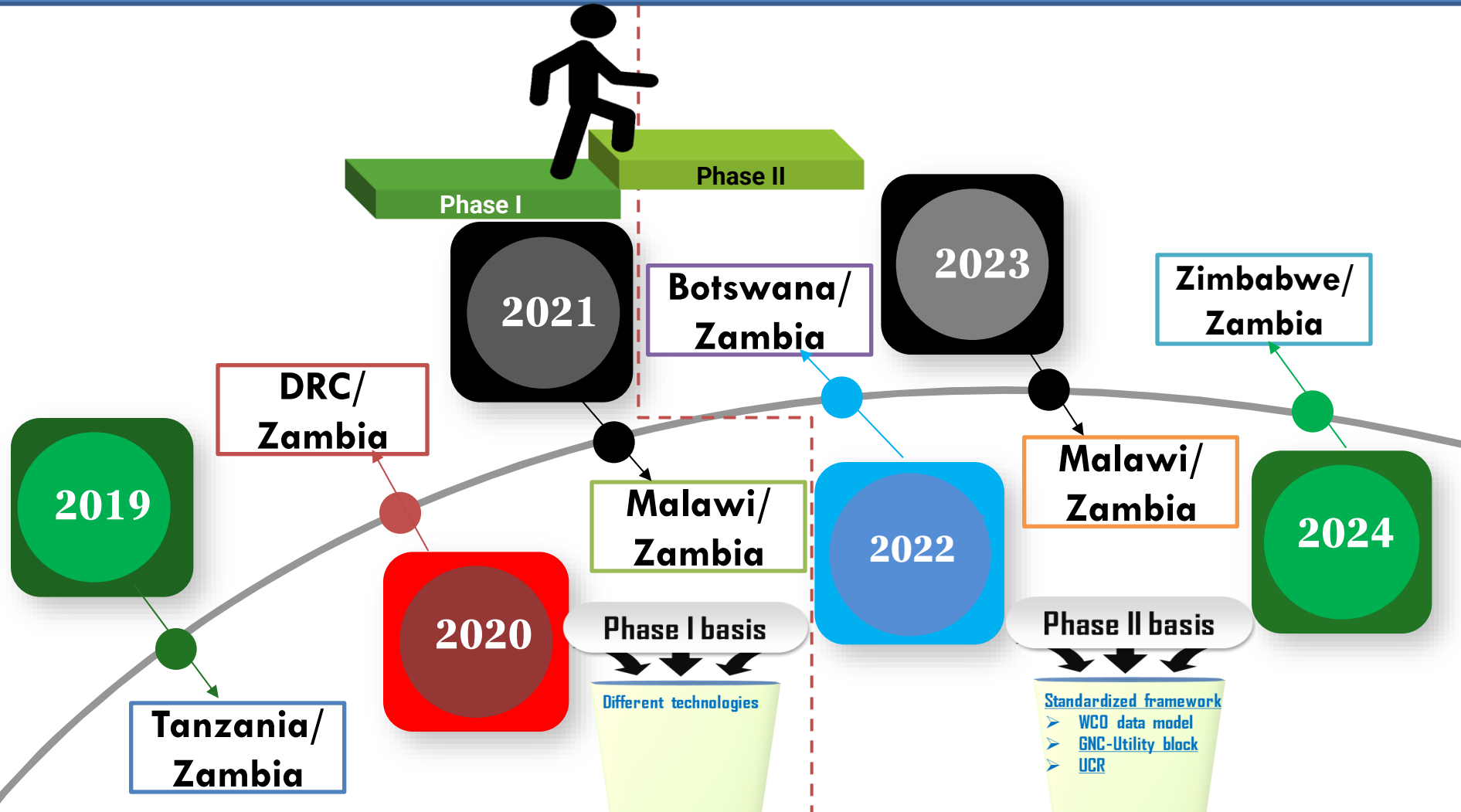
2024 Conference Mission

(WTO-TFA Article 12 – Customs Cooperation)



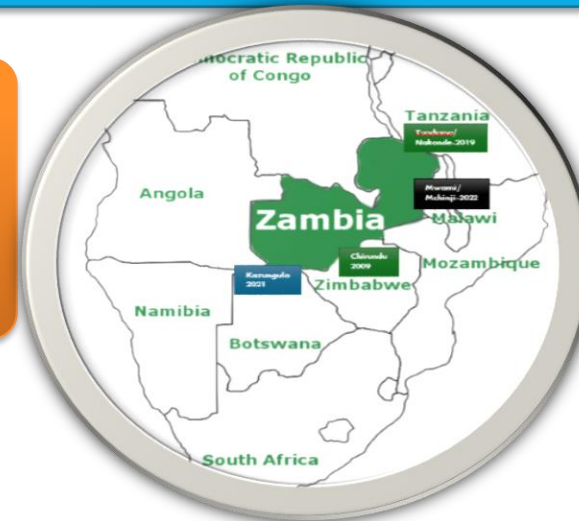
One Stop Border Post (1/2)

(WTO-TFA Article 8 – Border Agency Cooperation)

Cross – Border Clearances to facilitate the movement of Goods, Vehicles and People *(To fulfil exit and entry border formalities)*

Traditional Two-Stop Border Post

“Traffic in one direction stopping twice in two separate border facilities”



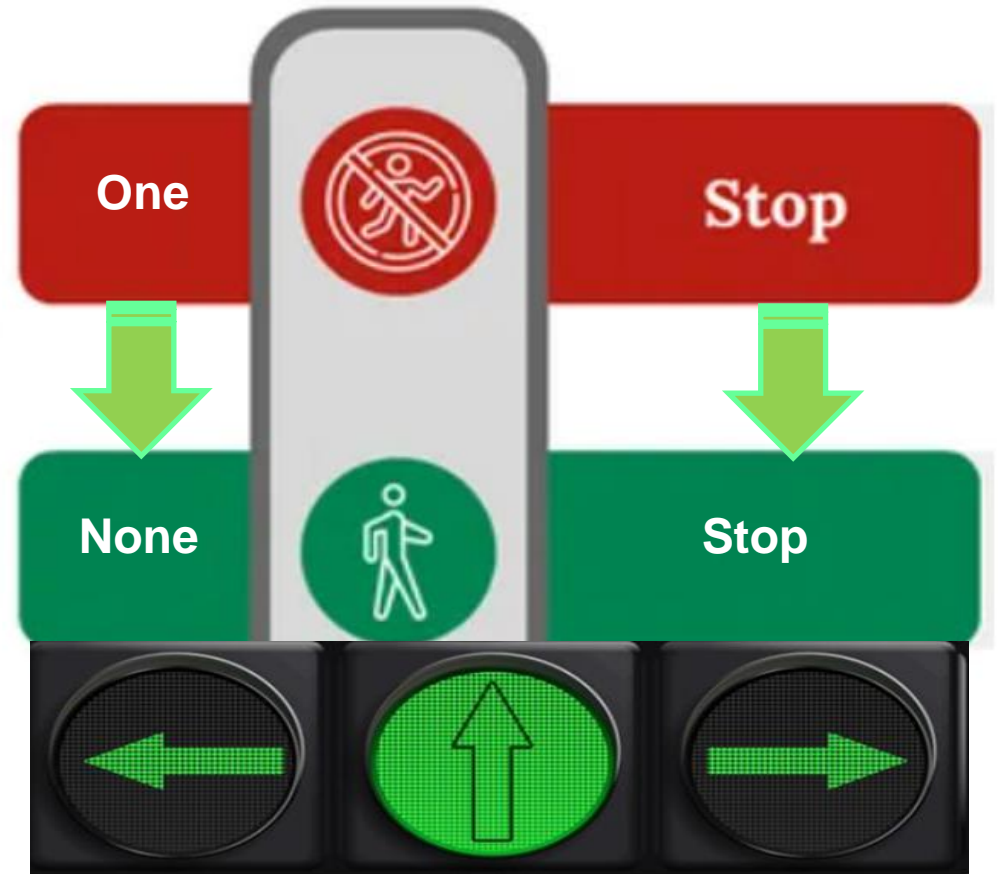
One Stop Border Post

Traffic in one direction stopping ONCE in a single facility to fulfil both Exit & Entry border formalities.
Operational OSBPs: Chirundu, Kazungula, Mwami/Mchinji & Nakonde/Tunduma

(WTO-TFA Article 8 – Border Agency Cooperation)

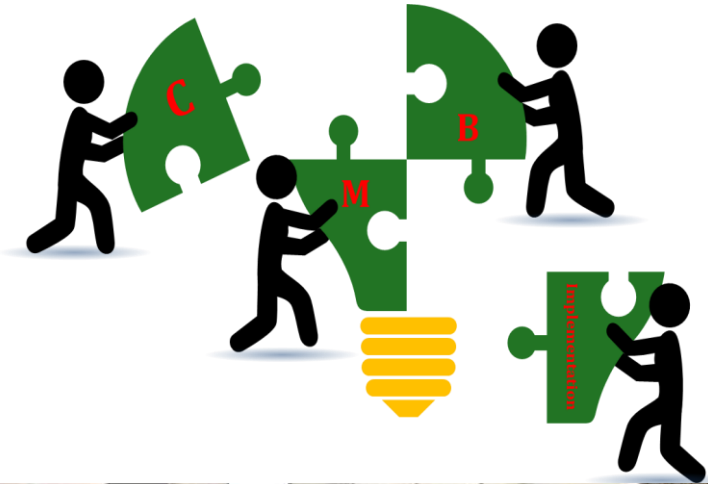

Coordinated Border Management

(WTO-TFA Article 8 – Border Agency Cooperation)

- ❑ 2023 Government Policy directive to implement CBM and began in January 2024 at Kazungula OSBP
 - ✓ Reduced to **6 agencies** physically operating the border
 - ✓ **Single Payment Point** with Integrated Payment System [*POS, mobile & Card payments, and online payment options*]
 - ✓ Digitalised and automated border processes onto online Customs portal
- ❑ *World Bank Group* supported the development of the CBM model for Zambia
- ❑ *WCO Accelerated Trade Facilitation Programme* providing capacity building to develop Inter-Agency Standard Regulations framework for establishing Standard Operating Procedures and Data standardisation and Border Agency systems interconnectivity



Challenges and the resolutions



Challenges



Resolutions

1 Different Systems posing difficulties to interconnect

Standardization of data sets using WCO tools and instruments WCO Data Model, GNC Utility block.

2 OSBP Infrastructure development costly venture requiring more capital outlay

Developing basic infrastructure, more focus on technology (*ICT systems, online platforms*).

3 Resistance by some border agencies in CBM implementation.

NTFC undertook extensive stakeholders' engagements and 'sold' CBM benefits

4 Legal hitches in information exchange, OSBP and CBM implementation

Used the Customs Mutual Assistance Agreements, Bilateral Agreements and Memorandums of Understanding



Implementations plans for next 5 years

Customs connectivity

Bilateral systems interconnectivity:

1. Democratic Republic of Congo (Phase II)
2. Eswatini
3. Mozambique
4. Namibia
5. Rwanda
6. South Africa
7. Tanzania (Phase II)

SADC Regional Customs Interconnectivity framework for member states based on WCO instruments and tools being advanced by SADC/WCO

- = *Already engaging*
 = *Not engaging yet*

One Stop Border Post vs. *None Stop Border Post*

Continue implementation :

1. DRC (Various border posts)
2. Mozambique -Cassacatiza/Chanida
3. Nakonde(Upgrading OSBP to Smart Border)
4. Namibia – Katima Mulilo
5. Tanzania – Kasenyi/Zombe

Advancing the None Stop Border Post concept in OSBP and 2-stop Border Posts

Coordinated Border Management

- Operationalize the developed Inter-Agency Standard Regulations framework
- Border Agencies Systems interconnectivity to enable data exchange and coordinated information flow
- Customize the Standard Operating Procedures to Railways and Airports
- Implement automated simplified Passenger Clearance process integrated with payment options
