


## 1. Overview

## Legal Framework:

#### **Agreement to Establish and Implement the ASW**



Member states agree to implement their respective National Single Windows (NSWs), which will connect to the ASW, ensuring standardized and harmonized trade procedures across the region.

## Protocol to Establish and Implement the ASW



It defines the legal and technical standards for the establishment of the ASW and the connection of NSWs of member states, the responsibilities of each member state and the coordination mechanisms required for effective implementation.

#### MoU on the Implementation of the ASW Pilot Project



The MoU details the scope of pilot project, the roles of participating countries, and the timelines for the testing and evaluation phases. It aims to identify technical and operational challenges in a controlled environment before scaling up the full ASW implementation.

#### **Protocol on the Legal Framework to Implement ASW**



It provides the legal basis for data sharing, confidentiality, and security, outlining the rights and obligations of member states. The protocol also addresses issues related to data privacy, liability, and dispute resolution.



### Data sharing Purpose

#### **Facilitate Trade**

Speeds up customs clearance and reduces delays by enabling electronic document exchange



#### **Enhance Risk Management**

Improves risk management through real-time data sharing to detect potential threats.

#### **Boost Revenue Collection**

Ensures accurate trade data, helping governments collect correct duties and taxes.


A digital platform for exchanging Certificates of Origin (e-Form D).




