Only the queries received by 10th February 2022 will be discussed in the Annual General Body Meeting to be held on 20th February 2022.



#### **4. To confirm the Audited Statements of accounts for the year 2019 – 2020**

The Audited accounts were projected. Dr Pradip, Dr Ahmed proposed and Dr Prashant seconded passing of accounts and audited accounts for the year 2019-2020 were passed.

## 5. General Secretary's Annual Report

Dr Srinivas Samavedam presented report of General Secretary. He remarked that it is tumultuous and unprecedented year in history of ISCCM that President and General Secretary could not visit Secretariat office during their tenure. The excellent support has been received from Executive Committee, ICCM Board and office staff in executing online running of society for full year.

Dr Srinivas Samavedam - Last time members met each other at Criticare 2020, Hyderabad and are yet to meet each other again. It would have been very good if we were able to meet in Mumbai for a part of this conference, but the fate is not in our control.

## Membership

Society continues to grow. Membership trends are much better if observed over last 3 years despite the fact that we are affected by pandemic and have not been able to reach members as effective as we thought to be.

Delhi NCR, Faridabad and Bangalore branches have done exceedingly well for membership. The average membership is satisfactory from point of view of society.

## EC meetings

We have accepted meetings electronically and virtual EC meetings have become norm. All 4 EC meetings were online, well attended and fruitful. We have laid down sops for online EC meetings. Inspite of online meetings, almost 100% attendance was recorded in meetings reflecting commitment of members.

## Election results for 2021-23

Dr Srinivas Samavedam informed names of EC members - Dr Sheila Nainan Myatra, Dr Rahul Pandit, Dr Khusrav Bajan, Dr Suresh Ramasubban and Dr Raymond Savio who were completing their term. He appreciated their contributions and efforts during their tenure and gave them best wishes for future.

**Indian Journal of Critical Care Medicine (IJCCM)**

IJCCM has charted new frontiers despite difficult year of publication, communication, review and editorial submissions. IJCCM has entered 25th year of publication under able guidance of Dr Atul Kulkarni. The journal is ORCID compliant and most of authors and reviewers are ORCID registered individuals. IJCCM has made CTRI registration mandatory for prospective studies.

It is compliant with directory of open access journals. It is step in right direction for making higher impact value.

The membership of committee of publication ethics in process. Hopefully in this year this milestone will be achieved.

Indexing in Medline is in process. This will further add to impact value.

It is timely publication and we are now able to generate IJCCM publication in same month within first 3 weeks

Last year 1650 articles were submitted and less than fifth 307 were accepted reflecting rigorous review process and scrutiny process of IJCCM.

IJCCM brought several good supplements in last year. Conference abstracts were published for first time with all abstracts having their own DOI.

Special guidelines issue was brought out with 4 Guidelines/Position statements of ISCCM

IJCCM also published ISCCM Guidelines and 2 Position Statements for management of COVID-19 patients under banner of Advancing frontiers in Critical Care.

Dr Srinivas Samavedam appreciated all authors and editors of IJCCM – a landmark publication of ISCCM.

## **Publications**

Critical Care Update 2021 book is coming up. It is ready for release in around month. ISCCM Textbook of Critical Care Medicine with dedicated section on covid is making progress. We hope to release it during Ahmedabad Criticare 2022 conference

## **Guidelines**

Several guidelines were published and we have brought out various position statements. Surviving sepsis guidelines covid recommendations were also endorsed.

The Guidelines Committee has envisaged generation of several guidelines.

## **Website**

Communication Committee has spent relentless hours in making website more effective. With support of Mr Ninad Tayade and other office staff, the website has new look and it is more user friendly based on feedback received. It is means of communication with members during period of lack of physical meetings.

## **Research committee**

It has been in forefront of holding ethos and principles of ISCCM. Their first point was to prepare vision statement. The types of support from ISCCM has been categorized. SOPs for research submission have been created. An independent central ethics committee has been constituted under ISCCM. We have created opportunities to train members in Research Methodology.

Dr Srinivas Samavedam congratulated Dr J V Peter and his team for coming out with vision statement. 2 research grants have been released.

Mid-career research training and opportunities have been created on recommendation of Research Committee. We have floated ISCCM scholarship for mid-career research training. 1 national and 1 international grant will be given. Rs 5 lacs is maximum for national and Rs 10 lacs is maximum for international program.

ISCCM Grant for in training research has been proposed for giving grant to trainees of IFCCM, DNB and DM. 4 such grants will be given for Rs 2.5 lacs for each recipient.

Constitution of an independent central ethics committee (ICEC) under ISCCM is crowning achievement of Dr Dhruva Chaudhry, President which he was able to do under Chairmanship of Dr Mradul Daga. Hope the committee will start functioning soon.

## **Partnership with other professional bodies.**

We have entered in fruitful partnership with IMA. Taken message of covid care including Mechanical Ventilation in hinterland of country ably supported by 2 Past Presidents - Dr Narendra Rungta and Dr Kapil Zirpe supported by our senior member Dr Banambar Ray. Sessions were well received and have received appreciation of IMA.

We have also entered in fruitful partnership of Indian Society of Organ Transplantation as well as Society of Cardiac and lung transplant surgeons of India. They have put ISCCM President as coopted member in their Executive Committee. With these professional associations, ISCCM footprint continues its map in India which was started by previous committees.

We conducted close to 48 webinars on covid through IMA and attendance is 45 to 100. These webinars set tone for country to start battle as Dr Yatin Mehta presented as successful fight against enemy.

## **Medvarsity Covid Sessions**

We entered in fruitful partnership with Medvarsity to do covid sessions. Some were live sessions where we demonstrated Mechanical ventilation, Proning and techniques which subsequently became indispensable in management of covid. We have done 14 such sessions with Medvarsity and has drawn praise from Dr Sangita Reddy.

## **New Courses**

Several new courses have been mooted and started. It is testament of commitment to training as basic ethos of society.

## **Social media**

Communication committee has been dynamic group of members who worked relentlessly to take message of ISCCM across country and beyond. He informed social media activities. Facebook live session is done once in 2 months. It has not only increased visibility but also acceptance as main line critical care society in country. He Informed about various social media likes and followers. Distribution of books and educational material is also helped by social media.

## **E Criticare**

To test resolve how well we are attached to academic programs a E Criticare was planned in November under pilot presence of Dr Deepak Govil. We had 3000 plus registrations. It was well received program. The feedback spurred to do virtual Criticare witnessed currently.

## **STEP Program**

One of success story of this year is STEP program. Dr Dhruva Chaudhry, President and Chancellor, Dr Sheila Nainan Myatra, Vice Chancellor, Dr Manish Munjal College Secretary and Dr Deepak Govil, President-Elect have designed execution and monitoring of biweekly program which is accessible through academy. We have been able to do 54 unbroken sessions. The average attendance is 308 persession.

## **Academy**

It is highlight of society. It is privilege only for members. It is our commitment to continued medical education of members and students.

## **ISB Program**

With initiative of President Dr Dhruva Chaudhry a program for acquisition of communication and management skills of leadership of ISCCM was mooted at beginning of term but it could not take off due to pandemic and lack of mobility last year. 50% discount for members has been discussed with ISB. We hope that incoming Executive Committee and Dr Arindam Kar will take this forward for logical conclusion in coming year.

## **Podcasts**

Dr Kapil Borawake and Dr Jose Chacko tied up to do podcast at regular frequency. Dr Srinivas Samavedam projected exhaustive list of podcasts conducted. He informed that these are well accepted.

## **ISCCM Day**

It was envisaged with critical care at frontline with patient advocacy as theme. Dr Srinivas Samavedam informed about how ISCCM day was celebrated. The Video release has been widely viewed on Facebook. Poster competition was conducted. The highlight of this year ISCCM day was release of postal cover - an initiative of Dr Dhruva Chaudhry well supported by Dr Pradeep Rangappa. It is moment of pride for society that ISCCM features on postal cover.

## **Benevolent fund**

Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri mooted proposal for benevolent fund. Proposals were discussed. A survey was done. Legal and CA opinion for how to make functional and financially viable is awaited. We hope to take to logical conclusion during tenure of next EC.

## **CRITICARE 2021**

Struggled to understand for how to do annual conference in initial days. We tried hybrid conference but things unfolded it to be not a physical conference. With heavy heart it was decided to hold virtual conference. We have a total of 7400 registrations for congress. 187 members for ultrasound workshop and 1,000 plus members for Mechanical Ventilation workshop and more than 700 in Hemodynamic Monitoring and Renal Replacement Therapy & ECMO with 300 in Skill development workshop reflects acceptance credibility and training potential which ISCCM offers.

## **Bank Accounts**

Dr Srinivas Samavedam projected details of bank accounts and balances.

## **Budget (April 2020 – March 2021)**

Dr Srinivas Samavedam projected major expenses. As per budget, we are likely to spend Rs 1,89,86,182 with major expenses on college, education and research which are prime motive of society. The estimated income is Rs 3,03,49,790 mainly from conference and college. The estimated surplus is Rs 1,13,73,608.

## **Our Partners**

The conference would not have been possible without our partners. Dr Srinivas Samavedam acknowledged contribution of Platinum sponsors, Gold sponsors and session sponsors who supported ISCCM in hour of crisis for conducting conference successfully.

Dr Srinivas Samavedam thanked members for giving him opportunity to serve as General Secretary. It was a good learning experience to work under guidance of Dr Dhruva Chaudhry, Dr Deepak Govil and Dr Subhal Dixit.

He appreciated Dr Subhal Dixit. He is epitome of ISCCM. He progressed to well-known personality in critical care becoming President. He congratulated Dr Subhal Dixit for excellent tenure in Executive Committee.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry praised Dr Subhal Dixit for his organizing and leadership qualities.

Dr Subhal Dixit thanked Dr Srinivas Samavedam for kind words. He thanked Dr Dhruva Chaudhry, Dr Deepak Govil, Executive Committee members, ICCM board members and all for their support, love and affection. He gave best wishes to all.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry thanked Meetings and More team for providing unhindered support.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry - we have now come up with new subgroup Innovation. We are going for patient safety and advocacy group also. The Prime Minister technical force under Director General of CSIR nominated President of ISCCM as member of and he had privilege of that which is big recognition by Government of India. In coming times, ISCCM will go higher and higher. People are looking to what Critical Care has done in social, medical and ethical part in epidemic.

Dr Srinivas Samavedam remarked that he hoped that he met the expectations and will continue to serve ISCCM in future Dr Srinivas Samavedam thanked all members and concluded presentation of General Secretary's annual report.

## **6. The annual report of Indian College of Critical Care Medicine**

It was informed that report has been already presented at convocation and college board Dr Dhruva Chaudhry - courses which could not be started will be started this year. STEP attendance of 60% has been made mandatory. College is thinking in growing further specialities. He appreciated and complemented Dr Deepak Govil, Dr Sheila Nainan Myatra, Dr Manish Munjal and Dr Babu Abraham for doing excellent job for conducting exams. In one to two years the college will reach greater and greater heights.

## **7. To discuss about the Constitution amendments**

Dr Srinivas Samavedam – proposed constitution amendments have been informed to all members. He informed that proposed constitution amendments pertained to provisions regarding eligibility to contest for post of President, Hierarchy for meetings. The guidelines for city branch elections have been also proposed. It has been proposed that One society One election norm will be in force and it is aimed to be achieved by year 2023.

The members were informed to post their concerns or issues if any for constitution amendments on question and answer chat box. No concerns or issues were received from members.

The proposed constitution amendments were taken as accepted. The constitution amendments were proposed by Dr Rajesh Pande and seconded by Dr Susruta Bandyopadhyay and passed.

## **8. Distribution of prizes and awards**

We would come with lot of digital presence through mobile app, digital corners, standees, social media and will try to reach maximum number of people. The entertainment will be back in full swing.

We would be careful on logistics, safety, accommodation and all aspects. The venue has robust check for checking communicable diseases. The travelling will not be difficult for delegates.

Dr Arindam Kar informed about places of tourist interest. He remarked - Lets all rise and shine. Leave behind pandemic and come together in 2022. He requested Dr Deepak Govil to address members.

Dr Deepak Govil – he was sure that Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra and Dr Arindam Kar will put robust scientific program. There would be good social and cultural events also. See you at Ahmedabad next year. Criticare 2022 will be discussed more in tomorrow's valedictory function.

Dr Deepak Govil felicitated Dr Dhruva Chaudhry. Members applauded felicitation.


## **12. Any other matter with the permission of the chair**


The CRITICARE 2021, 27th Annual Conference with pre- conference workshops was held from 24th February 2021 to 28th February 2021 virtually.

The scientific program was very planned by the scientific committee to offer the deeper academic content for management of critically ill. The workshops and conference were appreciated by the attendees.




## CRITICARE 2021 Registration



### 3 - Identification and Referral of Possible Organ Donors

This identification of organs and tissue donors is an essential step in organ transplantation. The identification of donors is one of the main causes of failure in the donation process. To identify donors, it is necessary to know the profile of potential donors and try to set up the necessary means to detect the anti and hospital services where potential donors will be managed. Transport coordination seems to be the backbone of all the work involved in donor donations. Advances in technology facilitate communication among healthcare professionals including definitions based on the clinical pathway for organ donation. Invasive Care to Reduce Organ Donation (ICRO) committee is another approach to consider in patients in whom assessment for donation purposes is feasible, and who are considered possible organ donors, with the aim of offering donation outside the ICU.





## **Fellow of Indian College of Critical Care Medicine (FICCM)**

Total 38 applications were received for FICCM. After due scrutiny, 12 applications were deemed suitable for award of FICCM.

### **Credential committee advised the following points:-**

- 1) We have developed two step application form. Committee expect details should be filled as per form.
- 2) Credential committee feels College secretary can play important role in initial assessment of forms received for fellowship and suggest active role of college secretary to scrutinise forms and forward completed ones to credential committee for further evaluation
- 3) Committee suggests that society should arrange physical session in annual congress to educate members regarding application process and marking system.
- 4) Credentials Committee suggests to add examiner of DM / DNB critical care to IDCCM & Fellowship examiner criteria.
- 5) Office should forward fellowship forms to credential committee in better organised fashion.
- 6) Format of application should be modified to include specific details on academic achievements and contributions to ISCCM.

## **Indian Journal of Critical Care Medicine – Editor in Chief**

The Biodata of all the candidates were considered for the position of Editor in Chief of Indian Journal of Critical Care Medicine.

The committee unanimously decided to recommend Dr Atul Kulkarni for the position.

### **Credential Committee (CC) advised the following points:-**

1. Editor in Chief is respectable post. The CC feels most experience member should contest for such post .He or she should have knowledge & experience in technical aspects of journal activities. For this we feel respectable member applying should have been worked at least as an Associated Editor in capacity preferably with IJCCM.
2. Ideally in selection process along with CC / President, Society should involve Past Editor in Chief of IJCCM as a Guest member.

3. The CC strongly suggest, rather than selecting Editor in Chief, we can select 3 Associate Editors and after completion of at least one term (3 years) they shall be eligible for Editor in Chief post. Committee can decide to choose one on the basis of experience, their performance and vision regarding journal for future.

First prize – ISCCM Best Research paper





4.1.2 For Elected Member, the candidates must be Indian passport holder, residing and working in India, the membership of the Society for at least 5 year is mandatory. For re-eligibility to contest election for any post on the National Executive Committee the candidate must have attended at least 2 (two) out of the last 4 (four) Executive Committee Meetings held in both years of his/her previous term. In case of such absence the member shall not be eligible to contest elections for two years after completing his tenure and he can contest after two year of completing his/her last Executive Committee post.

## EXISTING

4.1.6. No member except the president shall be on the executive committee for more than eight years regardless of elected posts held in the EC. After completing 8 years in the EC, the member can contest only for the post of President Elect. Thus the president shall remain on the EC for 11 years i.e. 8 years as EC member and 1 year each as President elect, President and Immediate Past President. Co-opted and nominated posts will not be counted in the 8 years. Apart from this only Editor of IJCCM & Chairman Credentials committee may be nominated after completing 11 years on EC. Total tenure in the EC for any member shall not be more than 15 years in any capacity henceforth. The tenure of Vice Chancellor will be one year. Tenure of Editor IJCCM and the Chairman of Credentials Committee/Research Committee / Guidelines Committee shall be fixed at 3 Years

## PROPOSED

4.1.6. No member except the president shall be on the executive committee for more than eight years regardless of elected posts held in the EC. After completing 8 years in the EC, the member can contest only for the post of President Elect. Thus the president shall remain on the EC for 11 years i.e. 8 years as EC member and 1 year each as President elect, President and Immediate Past President. 4.2.2 By the 15TH of MAY, the General Secretary And Chief Election Commissioner shall inform each Life member a list of vacancies in the Executive Committee of ISCCM and ICCC, and invite nominations for these vacancies through e-mail and it will be put on website on the membership page.

The nomination paper which shall be sent out will have the candidate's name, address and the office/post for which the candidate is contesting, and shall be proposed by one valid life member and seconded by another life member duly signed by the candidate, signifying his/her willingness to stand for the election and to serve on the Executive Committee if elected.

- 3) Candidates can use social media for canvassing.
- 4) If someone found guilty, he/she will be debarred from ISCCM election process for life time at local as well national level.

The candidates are allowed only for the following:

- Individual/personal phone calls to other member (no calls by surrogates, substitutes, juniors or secretariat people on candidate's behalf)
- Prepare the profile according to the prescribed format
- A video message for selected positions only, prepared recorded & edited by the ISCCM office & approved by the ELC. The recorded video will be posted on the website & YouTube channel & links of the same will be sent along with the profile link.
- Update their Connect profile

## PROPOSED

The candidates are not allowed to:

- Campaign in social media in any form
- No profile other than the one approved by the ELC
- No surrogate calling
- No individual or surrogate email or SMS blast
- No WA or telegram message
- Promotions through pharmaceutical industry
- Any academic or promotional program during the campaign period either physical or online.

Any complaint has to be submitted only to the ELC with objective evidence, then only it would be accepted & given due cognizance. No complaint can be made public during the election process.

The penalty for violation of election campaign process will be as followed:

For the candidate:

- Cancellation of the candidature with possible retrospect effect
- 3 years ban from:
  - any election process in the Central Committee & branches
  - any academic activity of the Central Committee
  - any examination process invitation or participation
  - any faculty invitation in national conference/conclaves/workshops

For any other member:

- 3 years ban from:
  - any election process in the Central Committee & branches
  - any academic activity of the Central Committee
  - any examination process invitation or participation
  - any faculty invitation in national conference/conclaves/workshops

No form of election campaign will be allowed during the voting process by any candidates or any member

The society strictly condemn & is having zero tolerance on campaigns or propaganda based on religion, gender, race, community or any other form of discrimination.

## EXISTING

4.2.6 In case of a vacancy arising out of an uncontested position, fresh nominations shall be invited by the General Secretary and Chief Election Commissioner by issuing a notice in Notice and Agenda for AGM, nominations can be submitted along with demand draft of Rs. 11800 (Rupees eleven thousand eight hundred only) on or before ten days of annual General Body meeting.

4.3.2 An 3 member Election Redressal Committee nominated by President, immediate past president & president elect comprising of members of good repute, having membership of more than 15 years with no personal interest in present election as well as in the election in the past 1 year and future 1 year & they should not be a present EC or co-opted member in any other sub-committee, would review the evidence provided by the complainant and would give its ruling within 15 days.

## EXISTING

4.3.3 If the complainant remains unsatisfied with the decision of the Election Redressal Committee, he/she may ask for hearing by the Panel of Arbitrators.

## PROPOSED

4.3.3 If the complainant remains unsatisfied with the decision of the Election Redressal Committee, he/she may ask for hearing by the mediation panel.

## EXISTING

4.3.3.1. Every attempt shall be made to avoid arbitration by constituting a bench of three past presidents who have not participated in the decision making in Redressal Committee to find an amicable solution.

## PROPOSED

4.3.3.1. An 3 member Election mediation committee nominated by President, immediate past president & president elect comprising of members of good repute, having membership of more than 15 years with no personal interest in present election as well as in the election in the past 1 year and future 1 year & they should not be a present EC or co-opted member in any other sub-committee, would review the evidence provided by the complainant and would give its ruling within 15 days..

## EXISTING

4.3.3.2 Past President/s who have not been part of the Redressal committee shall be nominated to the arbitration by the society. In any case, complete panel of arbitrators should be acceptable to all parties holding stake in the election process.

## PROPOSED

4.3.3.2 If the complainant remains unsatisfied with the decision of the Election mediation committee, he/she may ask for hearing by the arbitration panel. The arbitration panel will be nominated by President, immediate past president & president elect. In any case, complete panel of arbitrators should be acceptable to all parties holding stake in the election process.

4.3.4 The Panel of Arbitrators shall comprise of

- i) 2 Past Presidents
- ii) Retired High Court Judge / Eminent Jurist

## PROPOSED

With this provision the Chairman can continue for no longer than 3 terms. The immediate past chairman and secretary will be ex-officio members of the next EC of the branch.

These dismissed office bearers will not be eligible for re-election to any executive / academic committee posts in the City Branches or National Executive Committee of ISCCM for a period of four years.

## PROPOSED

13.11.20 The National Executive Committee alternatively (over and above clause) reserves the rights to dissolve the city branch or only dismiss the office bearers of the City Branch with caretaker office bearers in their place till fresh elections are held (within three months) should clause for election be not complied for a period one year.

These dismissed office bearers will not be eligible for re-election to any executive / academic committee posts in the City Branches or National Executive Committee of ISCCM for a period of four years.


