1. Condolences

The members observed a silence of one minute in respect of departed souls.

2. Confirmation of the Minutes of the last Annual General Body meeting held online on 27th February 2021

Dr Arindam Kar projected minutes of the last AGM. Members were informed that said minutes have been already circulated earlier. There were no questions. Dr Yash Javeri proposed and Dr Sudhir Khunteta seconded and minutes were passed.

3. To confirm the Audited Statements of accounts for the year 2020 – 2021

Dr Arindam Kar projected audited accounts and informed details of income, expenses, Fixed assets, Investments, assets, and liabilities to members.

Dr Rajesh Pande proposed and Dr Manish Munjal seconded passing of accounts and audited accounts for the year 2020-2021 were passed.

4. General Secretary's Annual Report

Dr Arindam Kar presented detailed report of General Secretary.

Branches

He informed names of new branches formed with number members at initiation and at present.

Membership

Dr Arindam Kar informed that there were 1,271 new members during the year. He informed their numbers membership category wise. He informed a zone wise distribution of total members. He also informed about new members per quarter, total no of members state wise and number of members from different parts of the world. There are approximately 10,000 male members, 3,622 female members and 2 transgender members. Almost 60% of the members are below the age of 45.

Finance committee

GST and TDS returns are done on time. The updated invoice system is in process. Dadar offices have been renovated. Rs 56,10,253 have been paid for this. ISCCM day was celebrated and research conclave was held on 9th and 10th October 2021. ISCCM day expenses were Rs 60,20,870 and research conclave expenses were approximately Rs 16 lacs. A total support of Rs 35 lacs from society was given to family members of 7 deceased members who lost their lives while fighting covid-19.

A total of Rs 81,000 were given as prizes for various ISCCM Day competitions.

An Examiners conclave was held for first time on 19th November 2021. Its expenses were Rs 15.31 lacs. An alumni meeting was held on 19th December 2021. Its expenses were around Rs 3,20,000.

Criticare 2021

The receipts for Criticare 2021 amounted to Rs 1,35,80,999 and expenses were Rs 27,09,000. The entire event was absolutely free. Members applauded.

Due to covid 19 Criticare 2022 had to be rescheduled to 6th to 10th April 2022 with venue-Mahatma Gandhi Convention Centre, Ahmedabad remaining the same. Dr Deepak Govil, President was appreciated for regularising accounting matters. There is no penalty except Rs 10,000 this year. Next year it is expected that there would be no penalty. Members applauded.

Income Tax matters are pending for 6 assessment years. Appeals have been made and early hearing has been requested.

Dr Arindam Kar thanked Talati and Talati Chartered Accountants for their services for financial matters.

Dr Bharat Jagiasi thanked Dr Deepak Govil, Rajesh Mishra Dr Arindam Kar and Dr Rajesh Pande for their trust, guidance, and support.

Critical Care Communications

The editorial board comprises of all women. The topic-based issues are released.

Credentials Committee

38 applications were received for fellowship of Indian College of Critical care of Medicine and 12 applications were deemed suitable for same. The credentials committee has also given its certain recommendations. Credentials committee decided to reappoint Dr Atul Kulkarni to continue as Editor in Chief, Indian Journal of Critical Care Medicine. Credentials Committee declared ISCCM Hyderabad branch as best branch for Metro cities and ISCCM Bhubaneswar branch as best branch for non-metro cities. Best Branch award would be given during Criticare 2022 Conference.

Criticare 2021

Due to Covid pandemic, Criticare 2021 was completely held online from 24th February to 28th February 2021. There were 7,250 registrations and almost equal number of non-members had registered. More than 100 delegates from SAARC countries and 250 delegates from foreign countries had joined the conference. Dr Arindam Kar informed highlights of the conference. There were 6,87,472 total hits on conference platform in 5 days. Members applauded.

Dr Arindam Kar expressed his gratitude to the industry for their support, Dr Deepak Govil thanked Dr Dhruva Chaudhry, Organising Chairman and Dr Srinivas Samavedam, Organising Secretary for managing conference well. Members gave a big round of applause to Dr Dhruva Chaudhry and Dr Srinivas Samavedam.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry said dry run was done in October 2020. When we did mid-conference, the foundation was laid. He thanked team of Dr Deepak Govil, Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra, Dr Srinivas Samavedam, Dr Arindam Kar and Dr Rajesh Pande.

EC meetings attendance

Due to covid pandemic 13th May 2021 and 16th January 2022 EC meetings were completely held online. 8th August 2021 and 21st November 2021 were held in hybrid form. Dr Arindam Kar informed that it has been started to keep record of attendance in form of whether Executive Committee members were present in person or online.

ISCCM Day celebration

ISCCM Day was celebrated at Delhi on 9th October 2021 by conducting various activities and competition. A press conference was held to highlight academic activities organised to spread awareness and advances in management of covid. It was also opined for what can be done in future to improve infrastructure to combat any pandemic.

Family members of 7 deceased members who lost their lives in fighting covid were given a humble support of Rs 5 lacs for each family. Their families were also honoured.

A Telegram channel was launched on ISCCM day.

A detail of new concept of Connect was informed.

Guidelines Committee

Dr Arindam Kar informed the status – Completed, In process and proposed guidelines.

The Guidelines Committee has prepared SOPs for writing guidelines.

There will be reciprocal membership of Guidelines Committee and Research Committee. Chairman, Research Committee will be ex officio member of Guidelines Committee and vice versa.

Once guidelines are published, they will be promoted on social media.

It has been proposed that next year onwards there will be also a Guidelines Conclave with Research Conclave.

Research Committee

The Committee approved 2 new research grants – Grant for in training research and Scholarship for mid-career research training. No eligible application has been received for these research grants. Dr Deepak Govil appealed all members to encourage their students to apply for ISCCM grant for in

training research. He also appealed that those members who are in mid-career research and want to enhance their career to apply for ISCCM scholarship for mid-career research training.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry gave special thanks to Dr J V Peter and Mohan Gurjar for coming up with excellent proposals of Research grants.

SOPs for research proposals have been put on ISCCM website.

A policy has been made for industry- initiated research studies so there is no conflict with objectives of society.

ISCCM will soon have its own independent Ethics Committee.

First research conclave was held on 9th and 10th October 2021.

Communication Committee

ISCCM Facebook likes and followers have gone up. Members were informed to join Telegram channel as most notices, important information will be sent through telegram and twitter.

15 Podcast were put on academy. STEP N sessions are uploaded on YouTube and telegram. Contain Covid Campaigns were done.

ISCCM initiative to help – during second wave of covid pandemic there were 150 international friends who provided free of cost online consultation support on WhatsApp platform. National doctors day was celebrated on 1st July 2021. A calendar has been created for celebrating all important days and events.

All connected to college were invited to Alumni meeting. The first three pass outs were felicitated at Alumni meeting.

Examiners Conclave

First examiners conclave was held as exam process has to be better, stringent and for structured outcome of college and academy. The examiners conclave will be held once a year or in 2 years. The feedback of senior examiners and teachers will be incorporated in upcoming exams.

There have been lot of activities in Communication Committee. Now ISCCM office has full time graphic designer and Communication executive.

Dr Arindam Kar informed about number of applications for new institutes, teachers and reaccreditation. The names of exam toppers were informed who would be felicitated at convocation during Criticare. The names of 12 FICCM awardees were also informed.

The honorary Fellowship of Indian College of Critical Care Medicine for 2022 is conferred to Dr B K Rao, Sir Gangaram Hospital, New Delhi. The members applauded.

Dr Arindam Kar informed election results of ICCM.

The post of Vice Chancellor is vacant. The new college board led by new President/Chancellor will nominate Vice Chancellor. IDCM overseas course has been initiated. All step faculties and moderators have been given certification.

The fellowship in comprehensive respiratory support course of 1 year has been initiated and its registration will be started at Criticare 2022. A window has been opened for veteran teachers.

7. Indian Journal of Critical Care Medicine

12 issues and 3 supplements have been published. 297 articles were published. Dr Deepak Govil informed that a new journal - Indian Journal of Critical Care Case Reports is being started. Dr Subhash Todi will be its first Editor in Chief. To start with it will be bimonthly issue. This journal has been planned to help authors who want publish their thesis, case studies and case reports as that is not accepted or published in IJCCM.

Dr Atul Kulkarni was thanked for his immense work for bringing journal to reach high level. members applauded.

8. To discuss about Constitution amendments

It was informed that proposed constitutional amendments were emailed to members and were uploaded to website.

The membership fees have been freezed for 3 years.

The international fees were very high. Hence we were not receiving any applications. It has been proposed that international membership fees will be at par with national membership fees. All the proposed constitution amendments were projected, and members were requested to opine.

Dr Rajesh Chawla congratulated Dr Deepak Govil and Dr Arindam Kar for their work. He suggested that proposed changes in amendments should be highlighted. Any type of campaign should not be allowed. It is difficult to monitor and control.

Dr Deepak Govil – Last 2 years there has been lot of hue and cry regarding campaigning. This year a committee under chairmanship of Dr Farhad Kapadia was formed and suggestions of committee have been tried to be incorporated in amendments.

Dr J V Divatia – do Past Presidents have been removed from committee constituted for resolving election disputes. Dr Deepak Govil informed that a committee of President, President-Elect and Immediate Past President will select redressal committee members and criteria of said members. Earlier President decided committee. Now it is dilution of President's power rather than anyone else. Dr Justin Gopaldas – The campaigning should be allowed for candidates to inform themselves about members.

Dr Ajith kumar opined that democratic campaigning should be allowed.

Dr Atul Kulkarni congratulated Dr Deepak Govil and team for successful tenure. He opined that voting should be done for proposed amendments. Dr Rahul Pandit also opined that the voting should be done.

Dr Yatin Mehta – it is difficult to control. Industry driven campaigning should be prohibited and rest other campaigning should be allowed.

Dr Deepak Govil informed that restricted campaigning has been proposed. He named members who wished to opine. As democratic society all members will be allowed to opine.

Dr Kapil Zirpe – congratulated team for excellent work. He opined that the elections are won by achievements and credentials. It is sad that all are discussing and want to project themselves through campaigning.

Dr Pravin Amin – during our Presidential tenure we were very rigid about campaigning. He is personally against campaigning. The proposed amendments are acceptable. He expressed his displeasure for number of WhatsApp messages that were continuously sent which were unacceptable and invaded the privacy.

Dr Farhad Kapadia – As a member for first time he was irritated and fed up with the calls. Candidates cannot abuse and threaten in night. The Executive Committee and candidates who were at receiving end of abuse should not have taken passively as it has led to current situation. If election has crossed the line, then it has to be addressed immediately. We are in situation where there is a challenge against election. This has to be stopped and at end of the AGM it has to be decided that as society which way we want to go. Huge amounts spent for campaigning, abusive words, threatening calls, legal matters cannot be part of ISCCM. Candidates are allowed to campaign by putting their credentials and achievement in format where all get equal chance.

Dr Farhad Kapadia – Past Presidents putting letter that this cannot be allowed to be happened is objecting an act and not a person.

Dr Farhad Kapadia – for first time he got involved in non-academic activity. Post this AGM he would not take part in non-academic activities. Crossing of line, Court Case and inadequate resolution of abusive calls are outcome of allowing campaigning.

Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri questioned that whether Dr Farhad Kapadia talked about abusive and threatening calls on hearsay, or he had any objective evidence.

Dr Subhal Dixit – I was asked to form rules regarding campaigning. The amendment proposed are quite fair and should be adopted.

Dr Shivakumar Iyer – will go with proposed amendments. If matter is in court, then members should be restricted from commenting. Dr Deepak Govil – AGM is open forum. Any member's voice cannot be restricted or suppressed.

Dr Pravin Amin- he is disturbed by chat conversations. Questioning the commitment of Dr Farhad Kapadia is criminal.

Dr Pravin Amin remarked about Bangalore conference auditor's report. A particular member in Managing Committee did not perform his duty in that case. Dr Deepak Govil – this has been discussed in AGM, Executive and Finance Committee meetings. The case is closed, and he would not like to reopen it.

Dr Shirish Prayag complemented Dr Deepak Govil for conducting difficult part of AGM well. He appealed members that ISCCM was academic society and elections were not of assembly or parliament. He hoped that members through maturity will be able to see through the amendments and guide society.

Dr Pradeep Rangappa – the matter is sub-judice. Arbitration matter should not have been taken up by Presidents. He felt offensive by remarks of Dr Farhad Kapadia and Dr Pravin Amin. He remarked that all talk of evidence but have not verified facts. Dr Farhad Kapadia and Dr Pravin Amin have shown repertoire till election happened shaming candidate. It is vilification of facts and imperious action in front of AGM.

Dr Pradeep Rangappa – the matter was requested to be kept confidential, but nothing has been kept confidential. It has been brought to AGM. Issues are brought to shame and shaming has happened for last 8 months. The society has no regard to empathy and benevolence. He said that no healing of his wound would happen with the way past leadership was behaving. He said that he would like his recording to be placed in front of arbitration when matter goes for arbitration.

Dr Bharat Jagiasi enquired that whether candidate could apply for more than 1 post. Dr Deepak Govil clarified that candidate could apply for 1 post only.

Dr Ranvir Singh Tyagi – can matter of election be resolved in AGM. If only forensic audit is asked for and AGM allows, then can matter be settled out of court? Dr Deepak Govil – the case is sub-judice. It is difficult to settle matter out of court at present. In court the multiple issues have been raised and not the audit part. It can be discussed later and requested Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra, upcoming President to take it forward. The AGM is not empowered to discuss matter. The next court case date is 16th March 2022.

Dr Yatin Mehta – election process matter should not be discussed as it is sub-judice. He assured that for all Past Presidents who wrote letter, there was no malafide intention and did not want to defame anyone. He fully stands by what Past Presidents wrote.

Dr Atul Kulkarni – Past Presidents wanted incident to be investigated which has not to be discussed as it is sub-judice. The Past Presidents do not bear any ill will to society. The voting should be done, and matter should be concluded. The court and justice should take their own course.

Dr Omender Singh – Members not practising Critical Care should not be allowed to contest elections and deliver lectures. He said that it should be also in the Constitution that members will not promote any other society. Dr Deepak Govil – it will be informed to next Constitution amendment committee for consideration.

Dr J V Divatia suggested that there should be rule in election amendment that every losing candidate does not demand scrutiny. Scrutiny is not required unless there is reason that fraudulent action has taken place which has affected software or counting.

Dr Farhad Kapadia – As new laws allowed, the situation occurred. The members should not go by his interpretation and if they desire clarification, the candidates should be asked.

Dr Srinivas samavedam – the election process has caused concern for how to proceed in future. To dispel all doubts, the scrutiny should be done. He suggested that chat box content should be part of minutes. To his query regarding candidates' participation in STEP sessions, Dr Deepak Govil clarified that candidates will be not allowed to participate in STEP for 18 days.

Dr Deepak Govil – in proposed amendments the only contentious issue is election campaigning. He asked members that whether other proposed constitution amendments could be passed or not? The members were informed to type yes/no in chat box. The members were unanimous in favour and Dr Deepak Govil declared that all proposed constitutional amendments apart from election campaigning are passed.

Dr Omender Singh praised Dr Deepak Govil for conducting meeting well. Dr Deepak Govil thanked and remarked that AGM belonged to all members.

Dr Deepak Govil – Motion of proposed amendment regarding election campaigning is being put for voting.

Dr Arindam Kar – The motion is “Regulated equitable campaigning for ISCCM election is acceptable by members in constitution amendment”

The members were informed to see the motion in chat box and vote Yes/No.

The voting was also done members physically present at ISCCM office. The said members were unanimous in favour of motion.

Dr Deepak Govil declared that time for voting was over and thanked members for their support.

Dr Deepak Govil – he has been bombarded with queries to discuss court case and update. He read sequence of events:

Elections were held from 21st June 2021 0800 hrs to 25th June 2021 1700 hrs.

The Election results were declared on 26th June 2021.

1. June 5, 2021, complaint by Dr P Rangappa against Dr S Myatra to election commission, defying the Election Code of Conduct in an ISA webinar.
2. June 9, 2021, Chief election commissioner overruled the complaint.
3. June 23, 2021, complaint by Dr S Myatra against Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri & Dr P Rangappa to election commission, alleging inappropriate behaviour.
4. June 24, 2021, letter received by Dr Deepak Govil addressed to president, election commission and executive committee members urging them to investigate the matter, withhold the election result till the inquiry is complete and to take corrective measures for future elections. Dr Deepak Govil circulated letter to the Executive Committee. It was private nature of mail which some Executive Committee members leaked to social media. Dr Deepak Govil denounced it and also denounced those who have breached secrecy and honour of Executive Committee. It should have never been done.
5. June 25, 2021, election commission asked president to setup an inquiry committee to investigate the matter and withhold the results of election.
6. June 25, 2021, Dr P Rangappa again asked to election commission to re-consider his previous complaint against Dr S Myatra submitted to EC on June, 5, 2021.

7. June 26, 2021, Dr P Rangappa and Dr A Choudhuri submits unconditional apology to election commission for being engaged in an inadvertent conversation with Dr Sheila Myatra during the electoral process.
8. June 26, 2021, election results were declared in which Dr Sheila Myatra was declared elected by margin of close to 600 votes.
9. June 27, 2021, Dr P Rangappa complaint to election commission, president & General Secretary asking for the details of voting patterns and forensic analysis of voting process & alleging that the election commission is biased and favouring his opponent. Dr A Choudhuri & Dr Ajith AK also sent almost similar mails to president & General secretary
10. June 28, 2021, Redressal Committee formed, comprising of the president, and 2 immediate past presidents namely Prof Dhruva Chaudhry and Dr. Subhal Dixit.
11. July 15, 2021, Redressal committee concluded the following: The committee is of considered view that the complaint prima facie is based on perceptions, miscommunication and extreme competitiveness. There are therefore no grounds to entertain the appeal. The complaint failed to produce any evidence of tempering / manipulation in electronic process.
12. July 18, 2021, mail received from Dr P Rangappa stating that redressal committee is biased and asked for arbitration. He also suggested two names of past presidents for arbitration panel.
13. July 26, 2021, A mediation panel was constituted to resolve the matter comprising of Dr. Ram Rajagopalan, Dr. Shivakumar Iyer, and Dr. Kapil Zirpe (3 past presidents).
14. July 29, 2021, Received complaint from Dr S Myatra asking for penal action against Dr, Anirban Hom Choudhury and Dr. Pradeep Rangappa for indecent behaviour during the election campaign, further compounded by a dishonest apology.
15. July 31, 2021, Received complaint from Dr S Myatra against Dr P Rangappa and Dr A Choudhuri to EC for disciplinary action.
16. September 1, 2021, Mediation committee rejects the allegation of violation of election code of conduct by Dr S Myatra, rejected the allegations of victimisation, and laid down the terms & conditions for audit of election results.
17. September 2, 2021, Dr P Rangappa accepts first two recommendation of mediation committee but did not agreed to certain terms & conditions for audit.
18. September 3, 2021, Letter received from Dr A Choudhuri stating that he is willing to negotiate on first two recommendation of mediation committee but did not agreed to certain terms & conditions for audit.
19. October 28, 2021, after due deliberation with complainants mediation committee modified the terms & conditions for the audit.
20. November 21, 2021, Dr A Choudhuri also broadly accepts the recommendations of mediation committee.
21. December 7, 2021, Dr P Rangappa wrote an email requesting to constitute an arbitration bench. In between Dr Deepak Govil was trying to appoint person for doing the audit.
22. December 30, 2021 Arbitration panel constituted, comprising of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Vimlesh Kumar Shukla (Sr. Judge, Alld.), Dr Ashit Bhagwati, Past President ISCCM & Dr Yatin Mehta, past president ISCCM.
23. December 31, 2021, all 3 complainants refused to accept Dr Yatin Mehta's name for arbitration panel & again proposed the name of Dr P K Jain. They accepted name of Dr Ashit Bhagwati as they had proposed his name in first letter as well.
24. December 31, 2021, S Myatra refused to accept Dr P K Jain's name.

25. January 4, 2022, Dr Deepak Govil proposed name of Dr N Rungta in place of Dr Yatin Mehta.
26. January 5, 2022, all 3 complainants rejected Dr N Rungta's name as well.
27. January 11-16, 2022, EC & others sub-committee meetings were held.
28. January 25, 2022, ISCCM office received summons of the suit filed by Dr P Rangappa vs ISCCM dated 24-01-2022. Case was filled Bangalore court on 10-01-2022 asking for stay against Executive Committee and Sub Committees meetings which court did not grant.
29. January 31, 2022, Lawyer representing ISCCM appeared in Bangalore court, next hearing is fixed on 14-02-2022.
30. February 14, 2022, Lawyer representing ISCCM appeared in Bangalore court, asked for dismissal of case on 2 grounds. One ground was case is not in preview of Bangalore court. Next hearing is fixed on 19-02-2022.
31. February 19, 2022, Lawyer representing ISCCM appeared in Bangalore court for arguments, Dr Rangappa's lawyer asked for time to. Next hearing is fixed on 16-03-2022.

The case has been filed against ISCCM, General Secretary representing ISCCM and Dr Sheila Myatra.

Result of motion regarding proposed amendments – Election campaigning

Dr Arindam Kar declared result of motion proposed. The members who accept constitution amendment of allowing regulated and equitable campaigning mostly by ISCCM themselves and to some extent by the contestant itself.

He informed that Executive Committee and ICCM Board members physically present at ISCCM office have unanimously voted in favour of the motion (11:0).

For members present online, 127 votes have been casted. 103 members votes in favour of motion and 24 members voted against motion.

Dr Deepak Govil thanked members and declared that motion is passed. The amendments and new constitution would be effective from tomorrow.

The members applauded.

Dr Pradeep Rangappa – the AGM needs to know facts of the constitution. There were lot of lapses and fallacies in conducting elections. Pre-election scrutiny had to be done which did not happen. As required a complaint was lodged within 15 days after elections. 2 complaints were raised prior. One complaint pertained to campaign on academic platform done by the opponent which was not to be done. It was given with video recording evidence for which no action was taken. ISCCM proprietary was being used for campaign and even for that no action was taken by election commission. Election Commission acts in biased way. Past Presidents put tremendous pressure that we will be banned for life from ISCCM for taking up issue and to give apology. We wished result to be out so it was done.

Dr Pradeep Rangappa – Post election scrutiny is right of every contestant. He is seeking, pleading, and praying for 8 months. He holds ISCCM at highest regard and prays and appeals that election scrutiny will come clean. He said he will withdraw his all the complaints. He requested for scrutiny which will decimate all apprehensions. He is willing to spend Rs 1.50 lacs and for 8 months leadership has failed to get scrutiny done. In court it is appealed that handover should not happen. It cannot happen till dispute is resolved.

Dr Pradeep Rangappa – There is no joy in going to court. Lot of personal money is spent to safeguard sanctity of society to resume faith and trust of all members. It was respectful conversation. Punitive action is taken against me, and rhetoric things are said against me. The humble prayer and submission are for scrutiny. He said that he had emailed that he will withdraw all court proceedings and complaints. He is happy to accept whatever comes of scrutiny. If something comes in scrutiny, then

he will just refer it to Executive Committee. Even mediation committee was failure. He is happy to pay Rs 1.50 lacs for scrutiny for trust of all members and hold democratic values of society.

Dr Kapil Zirpe – mediation committee is not a committee to decide yes or no. It cannot be said failure of mediation committee. Mediation Committee never has failure or success. Mediation Committee tried level best to sort the issues amicably. The scrutiny was offered in August. Dr Pradeep Rangappa accepted but another candidates did not accept. We tried to do scrutiny for 2 to 3 months acceptable to both parties with consent of President. 3 parties were demanding. It has to be acceptable by all for going ahead.

Dr Kapil Zirpe – here Dr Pradeep Rangappa was cooperative during whole process but other 2 candidates never said yes or no. Hence, it was pending and delayed.

Dr Deepak Govil – He tried to resolved the issue at every level but there was lack of consensus amongst complainants. ISCCM Senior leadership had asked for 3 vendors and quotations were asked for. Even Dr Pradeep Rangappa was informed to send details of his vendors. I asked for 3 names but was given 2 names. They were tried to be contacted but they never replied. The third name was supplied by Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri. 3 contestants never gave in writing that if you go through scrutiny, they will withdraw court case. The court case is not for scrutiny. They talk of misbehaviour, inappropriate letter by Past Presidents, handover and misconduct of election by opponent. Now the matter is sub judice. At this juncture it is difficult to instruct anybody to do scrutiny.

Dr Deepak Govil – ISCCM is paying huge amount – close to Rs 4 lacs to lawyers for court case. ISCCM is unnecessarily being dragged in case and what reconciliation he can do? As court case has been filed against ISCCM, I have to fight that case. Let the court case be decided first and then go for scrutiny or what court says.

Dr Deepak Govil – It is shame if there can't be consensus on 2 Past Presidents. If everybody is having faith in no one then nothing can be done.

Dr Rajesh Chawla – He had started electronic elections and it has been repeatedly checked to find lacunae. The software was checked by mock election. Three election commission members had to enter their password for login in election system. Utmost care had been taken.

Dr Rajesh Chawla – Dr Pradeep Rangappa had filed complaint against Dr Sheila Myatra. An explanation was sought from person who introduced Dr Sheila Myatra at CME. He sent apology letter and all had decided that said was ok.

A letter was received from Dr Sheila Myatra that Dr Pradeep Rangappa and Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri called her in middle of night. The Election Commission met and decided to seek explanation. The Election Commission members had opined that if it was true then Dr Pradeep Rangappa should be banned forever.

Dr Rajesh Chawla assured members that whatever action the Election Commission took it was in best interest of the society. The Election Commission conducted elections fairly. Any type of scrutiny can be done. If any documentary evidence is produced or AGM agrees then scrutiny should be done.

Dr J V Divatia – we should accept decision of electorate.

Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri – the case has been filed by Dr Pradeep Rangappa. The withdrawal by me does not arise as I am not a plaintiff. There has been no pre- election scrutiny. There is no reason for why scrutiny cannot be done. That proposal was never given and put into consideration.

Dr Deepak Govil disagreed. He said that he had been speaking with Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri and Dr Pradeep Rangappa several times.

Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri – Dr Deepak Govil has delayed matter and it is passed to next committee with nothing fruitful.

Dr Deepak Govil - he tried to follow constitution in letter and spirit.

Dr Narendra Rungta – there were lot of accusation about regionalism. Earlier lot of seats were re

served for members from Mumbai. Friends from Mumbai and Maharashtra supported to end that and make them open.

Secondly Election Commission carried its duties very transparently and he supports Dr Rajesh Chawla, Chief Election Commissioner. There is no place for any accusation from any side whatsoever. Dr Narendra Rungta - words and adjective used by particular friend and member have no place in society like ours. He or many members are not aware of how hard previous Presidents worked while forming, promoting and allowing it to grow outside Mumbai and Maharashtra.

Dr Narendra Rungta proposed constitutional amendment that one candidate can refuse only 1 member proposed by Executive Committee. The members should introspect while they reject 14/15/16 past Presidents and want to occupy post of President.

Dr Deepak Govil - he is forwarding the suggestion to next Constitution Committee for due consideration.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry - the redressal committee gave ample opportunity. The issue was it was my way or high way where he had serious objection. He requested all friends who felt aggrieved that it was not bread and butter of members. They were doing honorary work to spread speciality. The redressal committee report is transparent. As per report it was extreme degree of competitiveness. Dr Dhruva Chaudhry requested Dr Anirban Hom Choudhuri and Dr Pradeep Rangappa for whom he has huge respect that it was time to move on. No more discussion should be on matter.

Dr Dhruva Chaudhry remarked that as Dr J V Divatia said we need to listen to members which voted and accept. The members should not be acrimonious. They should accept the decision, move ahead and be friends.

Dr Shivakumar Iyer - if there is no constitutional barring of scrutiny, we as AGM decide for scrutiny. If scrutiny is going to prevent then we should take that route.

Dr Deepak Govil - case was filed in arbitration. It complicates the issue. Once arbitration panel is there, we cannot do anything. The new team will take over and can plan as they like. Nobody is above AGM, but court case is above AGM. We cannot pass any resolution. The matter is sub-judice.

Dr Rajesh Pande - all redressal system has been addressed. In his personal opinion this can be considered only when case is withdrawn. The route of redressal cannot happen simultaneously.

Dr Deepak Govil - if case is only for stopping handover, then it has already taken place. There is no need to ask for new date, but it has been asked for. If at this juncture he orders scrutiny, he would be punished by court, and they would say that let us decide matter.

Dr Yatin Mehta - as matter is sub-judice, no committee can be appointed to investigate. It can be done if Dr Pradeep Rangappa and others withdraw case, and they agree to whatever scrutiny ISCCM agrees. The finding will be final and no further legal action would be taken. Both parties - Dr Sheila Myatra and Dr Pradeep Rangappa should agree to this.

Dr Yatin Mehta - None of past Presidents had any malafide intention against Dr Pradeep Rangappa.

Dr Sheila Myatra has won with clear mandate. Dr Pradeep Rangappa is also deserving candidate and has done very well. Future, the thing will open. He urged to withdraw case and it will be seen for what can be done.

Dr Ranvir Singh Tyagi - it went to court due to delay. As part of Executive Committee, he takes responsibility that we are failure to manage this case.

Dr Kapil Zirpe - if someone wants to do scrutiny to restore image as well as trust on Executive Committee, just withdraw court case. Get matter inside society and do scrutiny. Nobody was against scrutiny. By court case the matter has been sent out of our Executive Committee and AGM. Now asking for scrutiny is not right demand.

Dr Atul Kulkarni - members who have gone to court should withdraw case and then we can discuss scrutiny. Otherwise let the court decide.

Dr Farhad Kapadia recommended that current and future Executive Committee should level certain level of grievance before scrutiny can be done. The issue is not agreeing for who are going to be scrutineers. A common pool should be made which members cannot say that they do not accept. A system should be made of choosing people who will do scrutiny.

Dr Sanjay Dhanuka – if society and both parties agree then out of court settlement can be done. The discussion of the matter concluded.

Dr Deepak Govil requested all members to consider proposed amendment – President should be allowed to nominate 1 honorary international Life member without voting rights every year who has worked for ISCCM. The members accepted and approved the amendment.

9. Presentation of the report of the Organising Secretary for 28th Annual Conference of Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine “CRITICARE 2022”.

Dr Arindam Kar presented report of Criticare 2022.

He informed registration numbers. 4 workshops are completely free. On Criticare 2022 being deferred, late breaking abstracts have been allowed and there are 72 submissions. Dr Deepak Govil – late breaking abstracts have been allowed till 28 Feb 2022. He requested members to inform the junior colleagues as more and more participation is required from young members.

The exhibition centre is 1 lac square feet which will hold exhibition stalls, lounges, faculty lounge and lunch area.

Dr Arindam Kar projected scientific highlights. There are 30 international faculties and 300 national faculties.

Important activities were informed. The inauguration and college convocation will be on 8th April 2022. It is intended to honour founding members, all members who have supported STEP and Presidential Citation awardees at Presidential Dinner.

The Past President oration will be delivered by Dr Subhal Dixit.

Euro Asia: It is being conducted in collaboration with ESICM. It will be conducted on 30th June to 3rd July 2022. The registration will be opened from Criticare 2022. There will be 6 workshops and 2 days of scientific program in single hall.

Criticare 2023 will be organized at Brilliant Convention Center, Indore from 1st – 5th February 2023.

Dr Arindam Kar summarized the activities done during the year:

1. Financial regulations have been done and everything is filed on time.
2. Additional staff have been appointed. Mr Pravin Gaigawal, General Manager has come up with all SOPs documentation. Medical insurance benefit has been increased for employees.
3. Tried to support families of deceased members who lost their lives due to covid.
4. First time examiners conclave was organised.
5. A research conclave and college alumni meeting were held.
6. It is planned to have teachers and guidelines conclave.
7. IDCCM overseas course was introduced.
8. New Journal has been planned and it is expected from June 2022 onwards.
9. STEP N has been introduced.
10. Fellowship in ventilation course has been announced and its registration will start from conference.
11. The concept of veteran teacher has been introduced.

Dr Arindam Kar requested members invited as faculty in conference to update their profile in Connect. They are required to give their details only once. All ISCCM activities done by members will get stored and updated in Connect.

Dr Arindam Kar hoped to see all members at conference and Euro India conference. He thanked members and concluded presenting the report.

10. Installation of President

A video of growth journey of Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra was played. The video highlighted that he successfully conducted 10 Gujarat Criticon, participation at many international conferences, participation in spreading awareness on Covid and involvement in social services.

The video also showed that he started ISCCM journey as member on 27th December 2007 and various posts held by him. Criticare 2020 was successfully held during his General Secretary tenure. The members applauded Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra.

Dr Deepak Govil thanked Executive Committee and gave special thanks to Dr Arindam Kar and Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra. He also thanked office staff for supporting and helping in carrying out established policies and practices.

He informed that Ms Shabana Sayyed resigned due to personal reason and praised her for work done by her in college.

Dr Deepak Govil garlanded Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra with President medallion. The members applauded.

Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra appreciated Dr Deepak Govil for his exceptional leadership and contribution to ISCCM during Presidential tenure and honoured him with gold plated certificate.

Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra – as Vice Chancellor post is vacant, he nominates Dr Manish Munjal as Vice Chancellor.

Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra - the video is about how he has been made today and it is his story.

He thanked family for support. He thanked Dr Narendra Rungta for bringing him to ISCCM. He thanked Dr Kapil Zirpe for help. Dr Subhal Dixit was wonderful President and history was created with him by organizing Criticare 2020.

This year he would work with one intention – growth of ISCCM. ISCCM will have 360 degrees growth. The education will be priority and focus will be on research, networking and charitable activities. The focus will be to reach Southeast Asian and African countries and collaborating with them in conferences.

There will be 7 to 8 networks.

Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra informed names of Executive Committee 2022-23 members. Dr Tejas Kar-mata will be Joint Secretary.

Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra informed names of ICCM Board 2022-23 members. With Dr Manish Munjal as Vice Chancellor the post of Secretary, Accreditation is vacant. Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra nominated Dr Susruta Bandyopadhyay as Secretary, Accreditation. The members applauded.

He would work very hard and wished that his tenure would be of landmark achievements. Dr Rajesh Chandra Mishra thanked and concluded his address.

The video of activities done during Dr Deepak Govil Presidential tenure was played. The video highlighted Research Conclave, Examiner Conclave, Alumni meeting, Telegram, Connect, Contain covid webinars, Preparedness for third wave webinars, webinar on Dengue, Webinars in collaboration with TTS, Fellowship in Critical Care Ultrasound, IDCCM Overseas, new course FCCS, ISCCM Day celebration, new journal and STEP sessions.

The members applauded Dr Deepak Govil.

There was no other matter to be discussed.

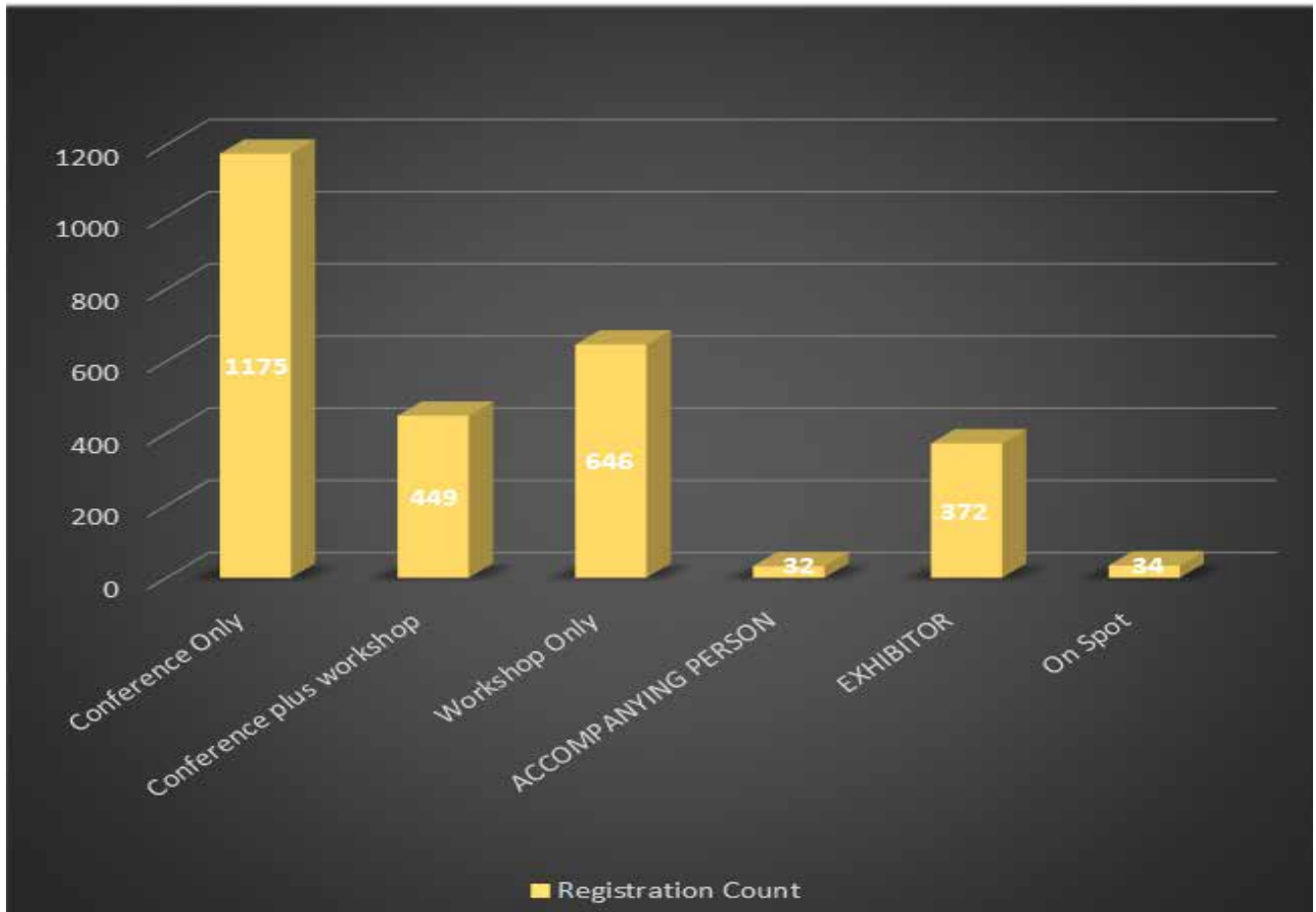

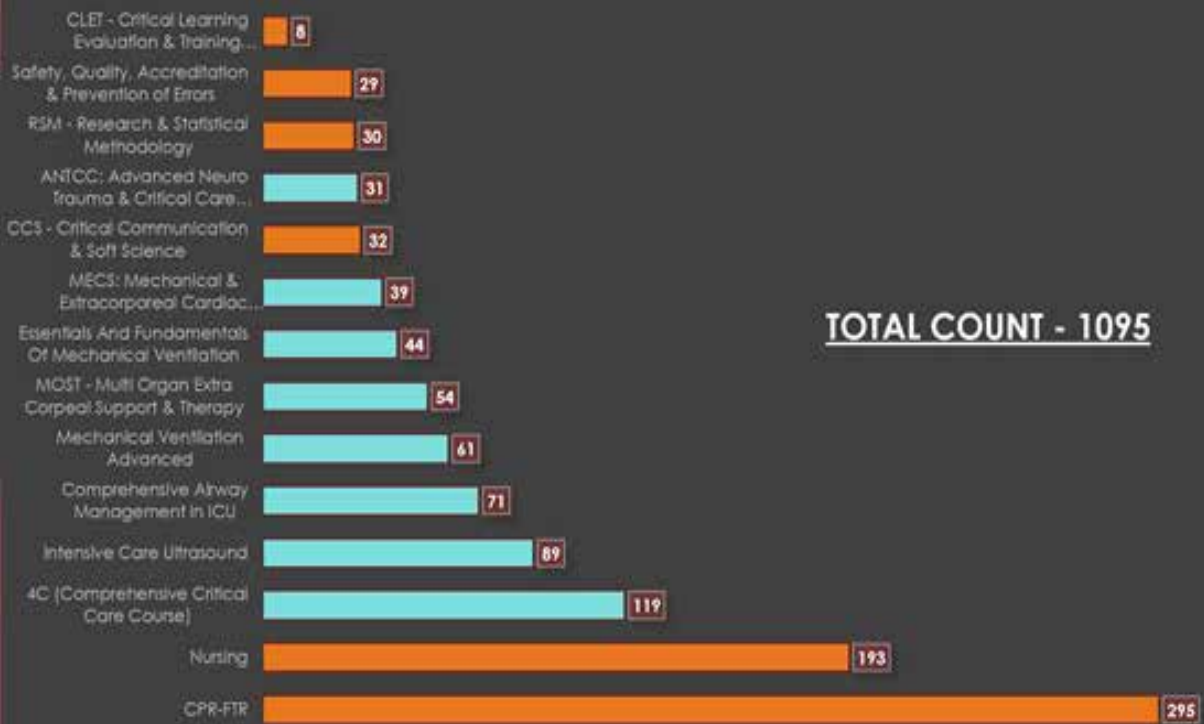

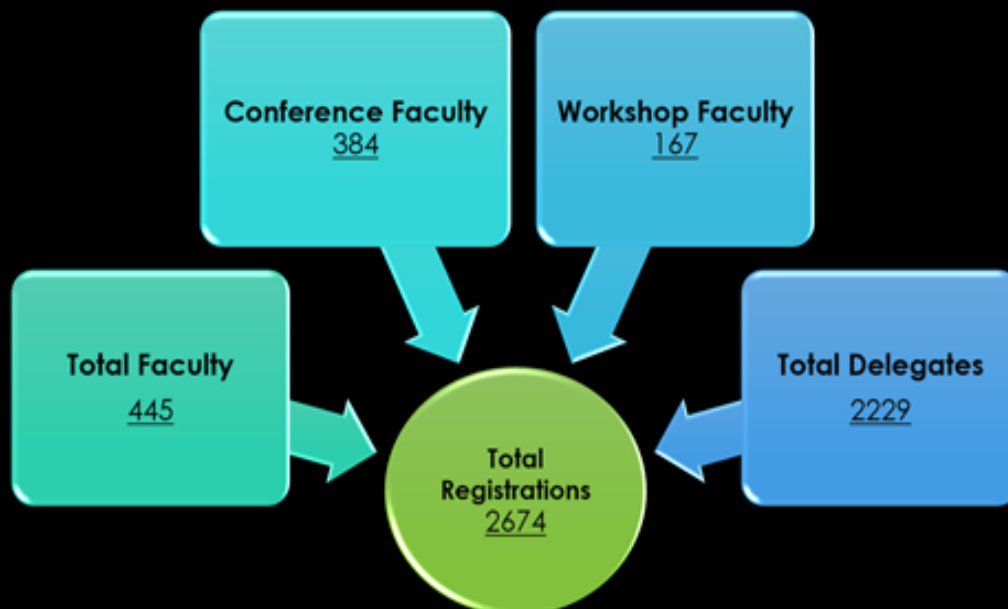
REGISTRATION COUNT

Total 37 applications were received for FICCM. After due scrutiny ,04 were rejected by office after scrutiny due to inadequate contribution to field of critical care medicine and finally 11 applications were deemed suitable for award of FICCM.

Credential committee advised the following points:-

- 1) We have developed two step application forms. Application forms are self explanatory Committee expect details should be filled as advice.
- 2) Committee suggests that society should arrange frequent physical or online sessions to educate members regarding application process and marking system. Unfortunately we have received so many unwarranted mail communications from members through college which should not be standard practice.
- 3) Credential committee is anonymous and neutral. It never looks into applications superficially. Scoring system is not 1+1=2. All respected committee members go through credentials provided by applicants in details and after due consideration / discussion of his or her contribution to critical care medicine field offers awardees FICCM.

4) Credential committee don't expect discussion on selection process. The Scoring system, eligibility criteria are predefined and approved by college (ICCCM) before CC meeting. During any extraordinary situation, college may request credential committee to reconsider his or her application.

5) Ideally, College (ICCCM) should approve credential committee report after submission and get final approval from Executive Committee (EC) before declaring to applicants.

6) Credential committee is afraid of wrong practice of challenging decision by applicants, and we request to discourage such practices at college (ICCCM) level.

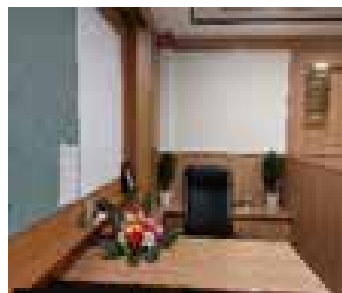
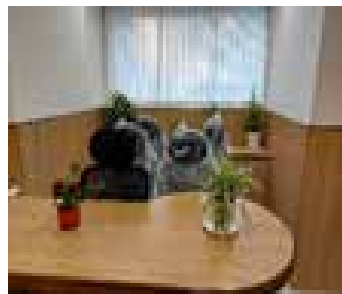

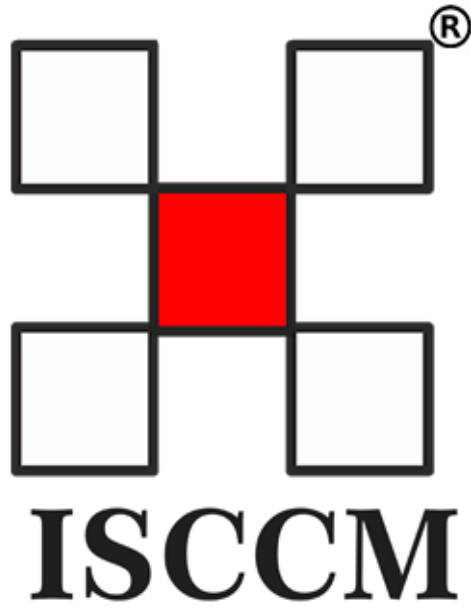
