

Ramgarh Shekhawati is a unique heritage town developed by the richest Indian 19th century merchants (Seths). It has beautiful structures - magnificent Havelies (more than 200), 36 Cenotaphs (Chattris), 101 Temples, which are great examples of ancient art and architecture of India. Earlier, Ramgarh Shekhawati was also known as Doosra Kashi, since it had eight centers of Sanskrit learning and cultural patronage. It has the only Veda Temple in the world, with unusual stucco sculpture and architecture. Though the town shows signs of aging, this doesn't make it any less interesting. It is often called the world capital of wall paintings (frescoes). It is now being revived into one of the most coveted heritage destinations of the world. Ramgarh Shekhawati is a forgotten surprise - A wonderland of heritage, a haven - to celebrate and to heal our lives.

DEEPTINAVAL IN CONVERSATION ON HER ENGAGING MEMOIR "A COUNTRY CALLED CHILDHOOD"




Deepti Naval is an Indian actor, director, writer, painter and photographer, A multifaceted personality, Deepti has carved a distinct niche for herself in the Indian film industry, winning critical acclaim for her 'sensitive and close to life' portrayals that emphasized the changing role of women in India. Deepti made her debut in the year 1980 with the path-breaking film Ek Baar Phir, and has sence appearead in more than ninety films, cluding Chashme Baddoor, Katha, Saath Saath, Kamla, Ankahi, Main Zinda Hoon, and Mirch Masala. She has received the best actor award in several natinal and international film festivals for her roles in Leela, Firaaq, Memories in March, Listen Amaya, NH-10, The Boy With the Top Knot, and others. She also won Best Screenplay award at the New York Indian Film Festival for her directorial film, Do Paise Ki Dhoop Chaar Aane Ki Baarish, in 2010. As a writer she has three books to her credit—her first collection of poems, Lamha Lamha, published in 1981. Black Wind and Other Poems in 2004, and The Mad Tibetan: Stories From Then and Now in 2011.

Her Recently Pulished Book "A Country Called Childhood" is a beautifully told memoir of growing up in Amritsar in the tumultuous 1950s and 60s In extremely visual and evocative prose, Naval describes an unforgettable childhood filled with love, adventure, mystery, tragedy, and joy. She uncovers, in great detail, life in an unconventional Punjabi family while plunging the reader into the distinctive sights, smells, and sounds of a fast-vanishing India. Starting at the moment of her birth on a rainy night, she tracks her journey to adulthood, a path punctuated by many personal turning points as also momentous events of national importance, such as the Sino-Indian War of 1962 and the Indo-Pak War of 1965

GAURI SHARMA TRIPATHI

LEADS A MESMERIZING CONTEMPORARY KATHAK CHOREOGRAPHY IN THE SPECTACULAR AMBIENCE OF THE RAMGARH FORT



Gauri Sharma Tripathi has trained in the classical tradition of Kathak, under her Guru and mother, Padma Sharma. She is the Artistic Director of her companies Amara Nritya Kala Hansa & ANKH Dance UK. The repertory of ANKH continues to bridge the teaching and choreographic journeys between the traditions and the new. A Nritya Visharad and a Singar Mani Awardee, Gauri wrote the three-year degree course on Kathak for London Contemporary Dance School, she was also part of the ISTD South Asian dance founding team, faculty, and examiner. She has curated The Alchemy Festival at the Southbank Centre for nine years and is associated with The Women of the World festival. Her curatorial work includes The Indian Dance Festival at the Korzo Theatre in The Hague, Netherlands. Through her varied work, she has brought a strong South Asian presence to the UK arts scene. Known for grounding her performance in the traditions of Kathak while giving it a contemporary viewpoint, she has toured her own solo pieces including Circa, Waqt, Ishmir, Timelapse, Vyuha, and Sacred. Her choreographic highlights include Polaroid Feet, Sacred Monsters, Ronin and Gnosis for Akram Khan, and numerous productions for Akademi, including Coming of Age, Escapade, Waterscapes, Initium, Sapnay, Maya, and Sufi Zen. She has also choreographed the theatre productions Mahabharat and Wah Wah Girls for Sadler's Wells, London. as well as Bollywood Trip in collaboration with Theatre Republique Denmark for the Olympic season. Collaborated with a variety of artists and organizations, from Shlomo, a beatboxer to create the first Kathak and Beatboxing choir titled Urban Vani in 2006, to choreographing for the Jagriti Yatra, a unique train journey in its 15th year in India. Gauri was also invited as a choreographer for the ICCR event, Azaadi ka Amrit Mahotsav at the NCPA, Mumbai, in 2022. She continues to bring events like Kathak Stanzas, Big Chair Dance with the elderly and Kathak Collective her company hosts. The most recent collaborations have been with The Dharavi Dream Project and Slagwerk Den Haag, both music and dance based groups.

FOLK FUSION WITH DIPANNITA ACHARYA

Dipannita Acharya will CREATE MAGIC with an ensemble of Folk Musicians from East and West-Three Bengal folk musicians and four RAJASTHAN folk musicians - MANGANIYAARS in an electrifying performance

Dipannita Acharya is a proficient and prolific artist in the genre of folk music with a voice, soulful and stirring. She is a globally famous virtuoso in traditional songs of Baul, Sufi-Marifati, Murshidi, Bhaoaiya and Jhumur from Bengal; Bihu, Kamrupi Lokogaan and Goalparia Lokogaan from Assam; Rajasthani folk songs and Gujarati Raas Garba. with the capability of presenting music in multiple languages. She is also a multi-instrumentalist as she plays Ektara, Duggi, Ghungoor and Satar (an instrument from Kutch) at her performances.

However, she identifies herself and her music as "Baul Anuragi" and 'Bhav Sangeet" respectively. Over the years, she has enthralled audiences with her rich repertoire of regional folk songs. She was introduced to folk music courtesy her own cultural roots in Chittagong (Bangladesh) that she imbibed and, for the rest, she absorbed the robust rustic singing style of her family, her social groups, from the Monosha Mongol and, later, from her gurus.

RAIBENSHE

MARTIAL ART BASED DANCE FROM BENGAL



Raibenshe, a folk dance with fantastic balancing act, which evolved from ancient martial art practised by the bodyguards of the kings and the Zamindars of Bengal. As performers were originally soldiers, Raibenshe was originally danced with spears and the dance form is characterised by vigorous body movements and balancing acts. Along with the energetic and masculine movements, it involves acrobatics by the dancers with a Raibansh, which is the long bamboo pole from which the dance takes its name.

Another interesting feature of Raibenshe is the use of stilt. The origin of his long poles heads back to the old times. The use of stilt made travelling faster and was used by the guards and robbers. The Raibenshe dancers have kept the tradition alive within the folk dance. The ambience for the dance is created with the help of musical instruments like 'dhak', 'dhol' and 'kanshi'. The dance steps and body movements shown in Raibenshe often carries the influence of Natyashastra as some of it are quite unfamiliar for any folk dance. It is powerful and attractive. PATTACHTRA PAINTING WORKSHOP BY ARTISTS OF ODISHA



For Pattachitra painting, the Chitrakars follow a traditional process of preparing the canvas. A gauze-like fine cotton cloth is coated with white stone powder and gum made out of tamarind seeds. This makes the canvas ready to accept the paint, made of natural colors. These colors are a unique feature of Pattachitra. The gum of the kaitha tree is the chief ingredient, used as a base for making different pigments by adding available raw materials. For instance, to get the shade of white, powdered conch shells are used.

Pattachitra is predominantly icon painting. Some of the popular themes of this art are The Badhia (a depiction of the temple of Jagannath); Krishna Lila (an enactment of Jagannath as Lord Krishna displaying his powers as a child); Dasabatara Patti (the ten incarnations of Lord Vishnu); and Panchamukhi (a depiction of Lord Ganesh as a five-headed deity).


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
