Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Haji Mohamed Ismail Merican is currently the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Board of Governors of MAHSA University, a Consultant Hepatologist and Internal Medicine Specialist at Prince Court Medical Centre, Malaysia and Chairman of Gadang Holdings Berhad.

From 2005 till 2011, he held the post of the Director-General of Health of Malaysia, President of the Malaysian Medical Council and was a member of the Promotion Board of the Malaysian Civil Service. He was also a member of the Board of Directors of the National Heart Institute, Chairman of the National Committee for Clinical Research, Chairman of Drug Control Authority, Chairman of National Poisons Board, Chairman of Medicine Advertisement Board as well as Chairman of Pharmacy Board.

He obtained his postgraduate degree in United Kingdom in 1980 and underwent endoscopic training in London and Tokyo and was selected the 'Most Outstanding Fellow of the Year' by the Japanese Council for Medical Training in 1987. He received the Commonwealth Fellowship Award by the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission for training in Hepatology at the Royal Free Hospital in London in 1991 and set up the first specialised Hepatology service in Malaysia.
