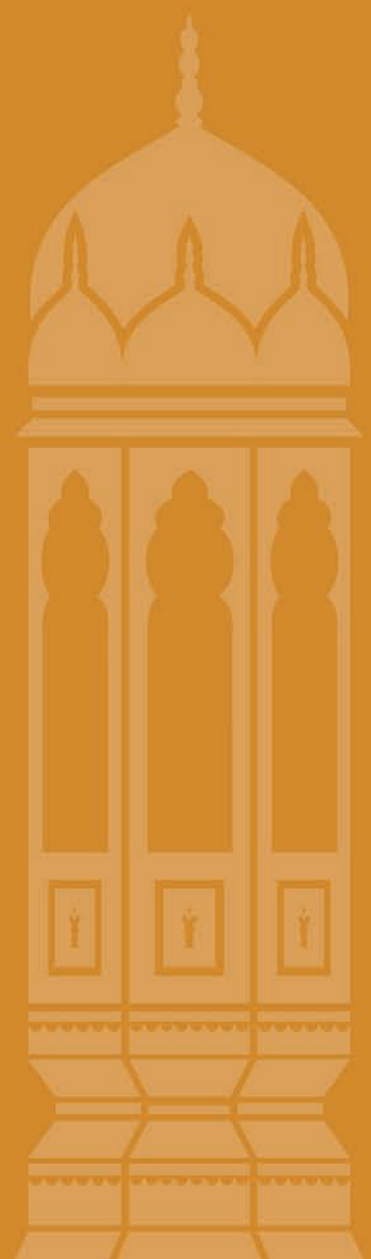

Jalsa-e-Jaipur! AN ODE-YSSEY

Founded in 1727 by the great warrior and astronomer Maharaja Jai Singh II, Jaipur-the first planned city of India, named after its founder, forms a part of the West Golden Triangle Tourist Circuit along with Delhi and Agra. Moreover, neighboring Jodhpur, Jaisalmer, Udaipur, Kota and Mount Abu, Jaipur has forever been Rajasthan's quintessential showcase, which has itself been time's favourite canvas-painted, worked-on and influenced by myriad events and history's hotshots. Leading to Jaipur being the abode of numerous famous monuments and edifices, kitchen to multifarious gastronomic ingenuities and home to world-renowned luminaries who have been leaving their distinctive mark on the world.

The section that follows will take you on a festive journey, an ode-yssey, which celebrates Jaipur!

PLACES TO VISIT IN JAIPUR



AMER FORT

Located in Amer-a town 11 Kms. from Jaipur, the Amer Fort is strategically positioned high on a hill. The principal tourist attraction in Jaipur, the fort is known for its artistic style elements. Constructed of red sandstone and marble, the attractive, opulent palace is laid out on four levels, each with a courtyard.



JAL MAHAL

Jal Mahal is a palace in the middle of the man-made Man Sagar Lake in Jaipur. Raja Man Singh constructed both the palace and the lake in 1610 damming River Dravyavati, which were later enlarged in the 18th century by Maharaja Jai Singh II of Amber.



HAWA MAHAL

Built with the red and pink sandstone by Maharaja Sawai Pratap Singh in 1799, the Hawa Mahal is a palace in Jaipur. It is a 50 Ft. high, five-storey, pyramidal monument built akin to a honeycomb with its 953 small windows called Jharokhas decorated with intricate latticework.



JANTAR MANTAR

Located near City Palace and Hawa Mahal, the Jantar Mantar, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is a collection of nineteen architectural astronomical instruments. Built from local stone, marble, bronze tablets, bricks and mortar the monument completed in 1734 features the world's largest stone sundial.

EXPLORE RAJASTHAN



CHAND BAORI, ABHANERI

Abhaneri, a village 95 Kms. from Jaipur, is famous for Chand Baori, one of the oldest, deepest and largest baoris (step-wells) in Rajasthan. Consisting of 3,500 narrow steps, it extends approximately 100 Ft. into the ground. Dating back to the 8th century, the step-well was used as a community-gathering place during periods of intense heat.



RANTHAMBORE NATIONAL PARK

Covering 282 Kms., Ranthambore National Park established in 1955 is a wildlife sanctuary known for Bengal Tigers. Situated about 140 Kms. southeast of Jaipur it is named after the historic Ranthambore fortress, which lies within the park and is home to the Indian leopard, striped hyena, mugger crocodile, chital and many other species.



AJMER SHARIF DARGAH

A shrine of the Revered Sufi Saint, Moinuddin Chishti built around his maqbara, the Ajmer Sharif Dargah is located at Ajmer, some 130 Kms from Jaipur. Built in 1332 by the Sultan of Delhi, Mohammad Bin Tughluq, the shrine is visited by pilgrims from all religions and it is estimated that around 150,000 pilgrims visit the site every day.



PUSHKAR LAKE

Pushkar Lake or Pushkar Sarovar is located in the town of Pushkar in Rajasthan, some 146 kms from Jaipur. It is a sacred lake of the Hindus where a dip is believed to cleanse sins and cure skin diseases. Related to the mythology of the creator-god Brahma, whose most prominent temple stands in Pushkar along with over 500 Hindu temples situated around the lake, it is visited by thousands of pilgrims especially around Kartik Poornima when the Pushkar Fair is held.



JAISALMER

Located 575 Kms. west of Jaipur, in the heart of the Thar Desert, lies the city of Jaisalmer. Named after Rawal Jaisal who founded the city in 1156 AD, Jaisalmer means the Hill Fort of Jaisal because of a fort, which crowns the city. Also, nicknamed "The Golden City" because of the yellow sandstone used to build the town and fort, which contains a royal palace and several ornate Jain temples, built of finely sculptured sandstone.



UDAIPUR

Udaipur was founded in 1558 by Maharana Udai Singh II of the Sisodias Clan. Surrounded by the Aravali Range, it is around 393 Kms. from Jaipur. Dubbed "the most romantic spot on the continent of India" by British administrator James Tod, Udaipur is also popularly known as the "City of Lakes" because of the seven lakes surrounding the city. Besides lakes, Udaipur is famous for its forts, palaces, museums, galleries, gardens and temples, as well as traditional fairs and festivals.
