Zambia's Southern Province



Visualize No Malaria:

- Developed data visualizations that help district health personnel understand where, when, and how to intervene during malaria outbreaks.
- Trained, through PATH and with Zambia's Ministry of Health, more than 3,200 community health workers to track, treat, and report infections.
- Includes now eight technology and services companies working collaboratively.

Tanzania

Data Use Partnership:

- Worked with the government to develop a comprehensive, country-owned investment road map for data systems and data-driven action.
- Supported the government's renewal of the national digital health strategy for 2019 to 2023.
- Leveraged partnerships to develop an enterprise architecture for the health sector to optimize the country's digital health systems.


Vietnam

Healthy Markets:

- Promoted health care-seeking behaviors, created dialogue, and shared information on HIV on Facebook to reach more than 240.000 at-risk individuals.
- Developed a Facebook chatbot that provides automated responses to common questions about HIV testing and pre-exposure prophylaxis.
- Partnered with the media company MTV Vietnam and popular apps to share information to millions of users.

Case study: Digital Square

Digital Square is a platform that advances alignment in the digital health sector convening members of the global community to collaborate in order to fund, design, build, and sustain comprehensive digital health systems. Digital Square works with governments to strengthen capacity, with donors to identify new ways to invest, and with partners to advance adaptable, open-source tools. Digital Square aims to strengthen country efforts to develop national digital infrastructure, supported by coordinated investments and a selection of high-quality digital health tools, so that governments and decision-makers can access the information they need, when they need it, to ensure better health data and health outcomes for all.

PATH uses the partnerships and experience we gain through our projects to better understand the unique barriers to digital health and data approaches in communities around the world. We encourage greater coordination at all levels, with country priorities at the heart of any digital or data system.
